

EIGHT BOYS ACCEPTED FOR C.M.T.C. PERIOD; TEN MORE ARE NEEDED

Of the quota of 18 allotted Jackson county this year, only eight youths have applied for the Citizens' Military Training camp at Vancouver Barracks, Wash., July 2 to 31, it was stated today by Capt. Carl Y. Tengwald, county officer.

The regular period for enrolling has expired, but has been extended for a week, the deadline now being June 19. In the past Jackson county has exceeded its quota and youths had to be turned down and this year the quota was enlarged, Capt. Tengwald said.

GIANT BOMBER IN BRIEF VISIT HERE

A new Boeing four-motored U. S. army bomber landed and took off successfully late yesterday afternoon at Medford municipal airport in an experimental flight. It was the largest airplane ever to land at the airport here.

The plane did not tarry here and none of the crew deplaned. The giant bomber simply landed, taxied back to the end of the runway and took off again on its way south.

The plane left Portland, where it made the same experimental landing, at 2:50 p. m. and arrived here shortly after 4 p. m.

PENALIZE LOGGER FOR LAW VIOLATION

The state forest patrol announced today that logging operations conducted by Roy Dorf in the Butte Falls district had been closed because of a violation of a law governing industrial work in timber lands. It was said to be the first such closure this season.

The closure was ordered by L. H. Morris, state inspector, who said that Dorf violated section 42-415 which designates that certain tools be kept in a sealed container for fire prevention and control. Dorf, Morris said, did not have the required tools and may not operate until he gets them.

On second offense violators are subject to arrest, Morris warned.
