KILL CIGARETTE TAX BOOST BILL

Washington, June 15.—(AP)—The senate finance committee unanimously approved today a \$1,007,000,000 emergency tax bill designed to finance the \$5,000,000,000 defense program over the next five years. The measure carried \$3,000,000 more when approved by the house and included an amendment by Senator Byrd (D-Va.) requiring a 10 percent reduction in all non-defense and non-essential expenditures. The senate committee, by a vote of 16 to 4, eliminated house-approved increases in tobacco taxes, including an increase from 6 to 7 cents a package on cigarettes. To make up for the \$76,000,000 of revenue lost the committee revised the house amusement tax schedule to raise an additional \$77,000,000 annually.

OREGON QUAKERS ABHOR HYSTERIA

Newberg, June 15.—(AP)—Oregon Quakers deplored in a telegram to President Roosevelt yesterday the spread of the European war and urged this nation be "kept from war and war hysteria." The yearly meeting of the Friends church made the request "on behalf of more than 3000 members in Oregon, Washington and Idaho." They asked that conscientious objectors be permitted "to engage in work for humanity which will not violate their consciences."

Grants Pass, June 15.—(AP)—Location work has been completed so bids may be called at any time on the Mt. Sexton section of the new Pacific highway. Location Engineer A. A. Kirkwood reported today. Governor Sprague has said work will begin this year. Kirkwood reported his men had completed driving location stakes for the entire distance from Grants Pass to Wolf Creek, now 25 miles. Mt. Sexton has been one of the most tangled high summits of the entire winding highway between here and Roseburg. On the south side of the summit there will be one sweeping curve instead of scores of them, and no five curves on the north side, none with an arc over ten degrees.

BULLITT GUARDED BY NAZI TROOPS

New York, June 25.—(AP)—A German military guard has been placed around the American embassy in Paris, and Ambassador William C. Bullitt "probably has been asked" to remain within the bounds of the embassy buildings for several days, Edwin Hartich, CBS correspondent, said in a Berlin broadcast today. He said German military authorities had taken similar steps with regard to American officials in the occupations of the Hague and Brussels. (It was officially denied in Berlin dispatches yesterday that Bullitt was held in "protective custody.")
