

### MARCH CONTINUES AS FRENCH AWAIT TERMS OF PEACE

(Continued from Page One.)

The British announced officially that seven of the invading aircraft were shot down by British fighters and anti-aircraft batteries which were in action all the way from the teeming Thames Estuary to the Yorkshire coast.

"No severe damage was done to any military objective" by the Germans, it was announced.

The British expeditionary force has now been withdrawn from France, London reported, and will devote itself to the "one task" of home defense. About 1,250,000 soldiers are under arms to guard against the imminently-expected Nazi invasion.

Nazi columns, Berlin reports said had thrust a spearhead toward Lyon, almost directly opposite the Italian-Swiss border, affording a nearby junction for Italian and German armies.

**Half Captured**

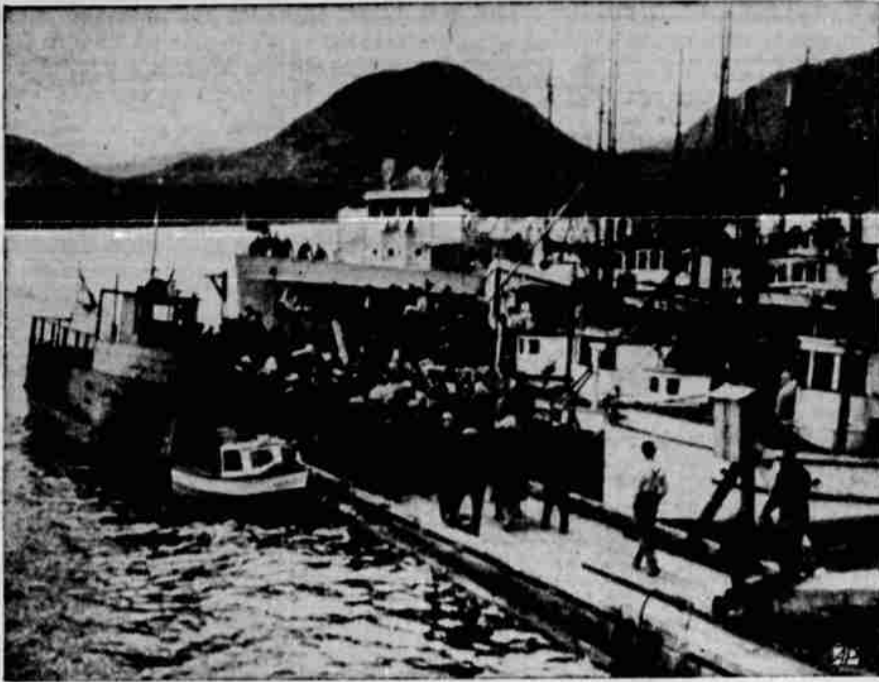
Berlin asserted that half of France is now in German hands, with the invading armies rapidly fanning out to the south.

Pope Pius XII appealed to Italians to be generous and spoke sorrowfully of "forces of error and deception."

At the same time, the Fascist Editor Virginio Gayda, often called Mussolini's mouthpiece, declared Italy can see "no reason to show pity for France in the present case."

### EUREKA RESTAURATEUR JAILED ON CHARGE OF KIDNAPING WAITRESS

Arrested under the so-called Lindbergh kidnap law, Chris Evigelenos, 44, of Eureka, Cal., was held under \$10,000 bail by U. S. Commissioner Victor A. Tengwald this noon on a charge of kidnaping Dolly McGinnis, 23, Portland waitress who was reportedly employed once in a Trinidad, Cal., restaurant owned by Evigelenos.

The woman and John H. Stewart, 34, of Trinidad were held as material witnesses under \$2,000 bail each. All three were placed in Jackson county jail under custody of Paul Hanlin, U. S. deputy marshal. The complaint against Evigelenos was signed by Willis F. Wood, FBI agent.

Evigelenos, who owns a restaurant in Eureka, waived a preliminary hearing before Commissioner Tengwald. The complaint charged that he kidnaped the McGinnis woman at Grants Pass June 15 and transported or caused her to be trans-

ported into California "for the purpose of reward, ransom or otherwise." According to the story told authorities in Grants Pass by the woman, Stewart's car was used. She was quoted by Sheriff A. Donley Barnes in Grants Pass as saying she received protection when the trio stopped at a tavern on the Redwoods highway just across the California line.

Maximum penalty under the Lindbergh kidnap law is death.

He added that he would also suggest that Senator Alben B. Barkley of Kentucky be recommended for permanent chairman.
