EX-R. O. T. C. HEAD AT OREGON DIES

Eugene, June 21.—(AP)—Col. E. V. D. Murphy, who recently retired as head of the University of Oregon R. O. T. C. department, died here Thursday, ending a life-long career in the army. He was stricken by a heart attack last week. Colonel Murphy, head of the campus military service from 1934 to 1938, was 65. He served in the U. S. army for 40 years, seeing action in Oahu, T. H., and Mexico. He was a Spanish-American war veteran and served with the A.E.F. in France.

Wilmington, Del., June 21.—(AP)—Wendell L. Willkie, who seeks the Republican presidential nomination, has been re-elected president of the Commonwealth and Southern corporation.

HOLMAN FAVORS BRIDGES OUSTING

Grants Pass, June 21.—(AP)—Senator Rufus Holman, Oregon Republican, favors the deportation of Harry Bridges, Australian leader of west coast labor. Niel R. Allen, Oregon department commander of the American Legion, received a telegram from Holman which declared: "Your wire of June 18 ably expresses my oft-repeated views concerning undesirable aliens in our midst. Freeing our country of these dangerous elements has been one of my major projects since coming to the senate. You may be assured that I shall give full expression to my convictions in connection with Bridges' bill and related legislation."

Allen, in the name of the Oregon Legion, had urged senate passage of the house-approved bill.

COMPTROLLER RESIGNS ACCOUNT POOR HEALTH

Washington, June 21.—(AP)—President Roosevelt accepted with "regret" today the resignation of Fred H. Brown, former New Hampshire senator, as comptroller general of the United States. 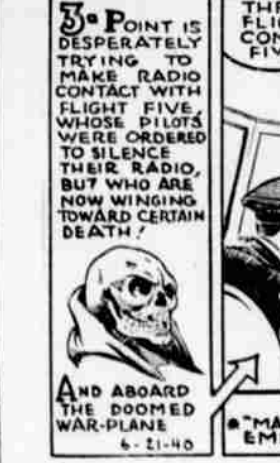

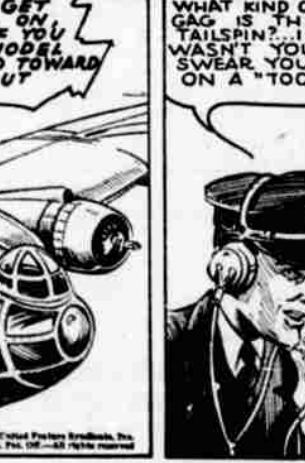
