

DRAFT LAW SEEN IMPROVEMENTS AT ONLY WAY TO GET UNION CREEK BY NEEDED SOLDIERS FOREST SERVICE

Sen. Lodge Says Only 8951 Recruits Obtained in Current Drive for 13,194

Washington, June 27.—(AP)—Voluntary enlistments have failed to raise the army to its authorized strength, Senator Lodge (R., Mass.) told the senate, and congress should adopt a compulsory selective service law so that "this period shall not be known as the Chamberlain era in American history."

Discussing the \$1,777,489,788 emergency defense appropriation bill (HR10035), which carried funds for 95,000 additional enlistments to bring the army up to 375,000 men, Lodge expressed his belief that the United States should have an army of 750,000.

Empty Gesture An amendment to provide such an army, he said, would be a "perfectly empty gesture," however, because the war department "is experiencing the greatest difficulty in obtaining recruits for an army of 280,000 men, and grave doubts are expressed by those competent to have an opinion as to whether or not it will be possible to build the army up to the very small number of 385,000 by the process of voluntary enlistment."

Lodge said the first, second, third and fifth corps areas had fallen so far behind their share of the 13,194 recruits sought in an enlistment program from May 16 to June 30, that their quotas were reduced and the difference added to the quotas of the other areas. Only 8,951 recruits had been obtained by June 16, he said. Meanwhile, the war department has allotted tentative quotas to enlist 38,000 additional men between July 1 and August 31 to reach the 280,000 figure.

Draft Bill Ready Lodge expressed the hope, "in view of the fact that we are not procuring men for this little army," that congress would enact a selective service law. Asked by Senator King (D., Utah) if he had introduced such a bill, Lodge replied that he had not, but would be "very glad to do so if I thought there was any demand for it."

"I understand that the war department has such legislation ready," he added, "and that it could be gotten up here in 10 minutes in the event there was a disposition on the part of the leadership here to support such a proposal."

The youthful senator from Massachusetts, himself a reserve captain, branded schemes to militarize the civilian conservation corps as "grossly undemocratic" because they "single out a group of underprivileged boys for special treatment, and I do not believe that is the right way to proceed."

Proposals to draft noncombatants, women as well as men, were denounced also by Lodge as an "affront to family life and to all our institutions."

Heavy Cost Seen He estimated the first year cost of raising the army, under a selective service law, from its present authorized strength of 375,000 to the 750,000 he advocated at \$1,487,583,349, and the additional annual cost of maintaining it after the first year at about \$500,000,000.

"This terrible war in Europe teaches us many lessons," he said, "but one of the lessons it has taught us emphatically is that qualities of mind and spirit, no matter how superb they may be, are no match for troops that are highly trained in mechanized warfare."

"Another lesson this war has taught us is that modern armies cannot be raised and trained after the war has started. It simply cannot be done."

New Warehouse, Water System and Gasoline Station Are Planned at Resort

Development of the Union Creek ranger station area in the Rogue River national forest was carried forward today as workmen prepared for the construction of a new warehouse, water system and gasoline station. Actual construction work was to begin as soon as all the necessary materials had been delivered at the site, headquarters here announced.

The new warehouse is to be a frame, shake-covered building 30 by 52 feet in outside dimensions. It will be built in the ranger station service area where it will be concealed by trees from view from the highway. Storage space will be provided downstairs while upstairs will be a bunk room for the accommodation of a dozen forestry workers.

CCC Men Aid Work. The lumber, bought through competitive bidding from a Prospect mill, was being hauled to the site today. White pine shakes, salvaged from culls at timber sales, will be used for the outside finish. The shakes were made by CCC enrollees. The warehouse will be built by CCC men under the supervision of Everett Rawlings, foreman. Fire-fighting equipment, improvement tools and other forest equipment will be stored in the new building.

Pipe for the new water system was being hauled to Union Creek from Sterling today. The water is to be piped from a spring 242 feet above the level of Union Creek, this decline to give a pressure of 56 pounds at the ranger station and 85 pounds at the public campground. About 7230 feet of six-inch pipe will be laid from the spring to Crater Lake highway and from there the water will be piped out to the consumption points.

The new system will provide water for the ranger station group of buildings, public picnic and campground area, CCC side camp, a private resort and a number of summer homes in the forest region.

More Water Needed. The new water system, said Karl L. Janouch, forest supervisor, was needed primarily for fire protection. The present system, he related, has become entirely inadequate and never has been satisfactory so far as pressure for fire-fighting is concerned.

The water system also will be built by CCC enrollees. Foreman will be Russell Brown. The gasoline and oil house will also be constructed in the ranger station service area. It will be like the new warehouse in style. Gasoline and oil, for servicing forest service automotive equipment, will be stored underground, the new building being intended to provide the safest kind of storage for gasoline and oil, Mr. Janouch explained. The present gasoline and oil building will be used to house an electric light plant if and when the forest service installs such a plant, he stated.
