CCC ENROLLMENT TO START JULY 1

Another period of enrollment of youths in the civilian conservation corps will begin July 1 and continue through July 31. Eligible youths desiring to enroll should apply immediately to the Jackson county public welfare commission in Medford city hall, CCC headquarters said.

The quota for Jackson county is 34 enrollees. Up to this afternoon only 17 had registered with the welfare commission. The enrollment requirements have been eased so as to permit acceptance of young men who previously had been excluded because their parents were not in financial need, CCC headquarters stated.

COLONY FAMILIES REACH G. P. HAVEN

Grants Pass, June 27.—(AP)—Four families of pioneers—Long Beach, Calif., variety—camped in Pleasant Valley north of Grants Pass today and surveyed the prospects of establishing a colony of loggers unwanted by businessmen and county officials.

Scotty Martinell, who brought his wife and four sons aged 9, 10, 12 and 15 years, surveyed the landscape with an eye practiced by working with lumber companies. He declared that it didn't look like there was profitable timber in sight.

Mr. and Mrs. Noel St. Germain, eight years a resident of Medford, said he gave up a job as a pipefitter for an oil company. They brought a son aged 4.

Marshfield, June 27.—(AP)—Secretary of State Earl Snell condemned hatred, greed and persecution motivating the European war today in the 25th state Eagles' convention keynote speech.

"The situation is serious and more or less of an emergency faces this country of ours," Snell said. "If we had awakened years ago we would not now have the war jitters."

TECHNOCRACY OFFICES ARE RAIDED IN CANADA

Vancouver, B. C., June 27.—(AP)—City and Royal Canadian Mounted police raided offices of Technocracy Incorporated here and at New Westminster last night and seized tons of records and documents which were taken to headquarters. There were no arrests.

Offices of Technocracy organization at Nanaimo, Port Alberni and Courtenay on Vancouver island were raided last week and literature seized after Justice Minister Ernest LaPointe declared the organization illegal.

New Zealand Plans Income Tax Boost

Wellington, New Zealand, June 27.—(AP)—A budget calling for the expenditure of 37,500,000 pounds (about \$83,250,000) for war purposes during the 1940-41 fiscal year and providing increased income taxes was presented to the house of representatives today by Prime Minister Walter Nash.

The budget levied an income tax of 12 1/2 percent per pound for the first 100 pounds of taxable income instead of 10 percent, the present rate. It will increase to 60 percent of each pound for incomes above 3,800 pounds (about \$11,500).

U. S. ARMY PLANES TO VISIT SOUTH CAPITALS

Panama, June 27.—(AP)—An unspecified number of U. S. army planes will take off at dawn tomorrow on a trip to central American capitals. They are to return July 2.

Official sources said it was "routine training."

BRIDGES RELEASES VOTES TO WILLKIE

Philadelphia, June 27.—(AP)—Senator Styles Bridges of New Hampshire, at the close of the second ballot at the Republican convention today, released his delegates and urged them to vote for Wendell Willkie.

Bridges, in a statement, declared he believed Willkie "can win and pull this country back from the precipice." Bridges' action aroused immediate speculation as to whether he might receive Willkie backing for vice president in event of the New Yorker's nomination for the presidency.

U. S. Cruiser Sails Toward Montevideo

Rio De Janeiro, June 27.—(AP)—The United States cruiser Wichita moved southward from this Brazilian seaport-capital today, apparently bound for Montevideo, Uruguay, where the U. S. cruiser Quincy has been stationed since June 20.

State Employment Sets New Record

Salem, June 27.—(AP)—The state employment service set a new record last week when 11,128 persons were given jobs. More than half the total was due to 5,660 placements in Multnomah and Washington county berry areas, and 1,308 were put on private industry payrolls.

Portland, June 27.—(AP)—Senator Rufus C. Holman assured Portland and Multnomah county interests today he would "leave no stone unturned" to obtain a \$1,500,000 WPA appropriation for a new armory.
