LEGAL NOTICES

Ordinance No. 3415. AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying water main on Berkeley Way from East Main Street south to Woodland Drive, and directing the recorder to enter a statement thereon in the city water main lien docket, and publish a notice thereof as required by the charter. CITY OF MEDFORD PORT ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: WHEREAS the council did hereby by resolution declare its intention to lay a six inch water main on Berkeley Way from East Main Street south to Woodland Drive, and to assess the cost thereof on the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property and did fix the time and place for hearing of the protests against the laying of said water main on said street and the assessment of the cost thereof as aforesaid, and

WHEREAS said resolution was duly posted and published as required by Section 116 of the charter of said city, and

WHEREAS a meeting of the council was held on the time and place fixed in said resolution for the purpose of considering any such protests, but no protests were at such time, or at any time made or received by the council to the laying of said water main or the assessing of the cost thereof as aforesaid, and said council has considered the matter and deeming that said water main was and is of mutual benefit to said city and that all property to be assessed therefor will be benefited thereby to the extent of the probable amount of the respective assessments to be levied against said property, did order said water main laid, and

WHEREAS the laying of said water main was held in accordance with and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$1,115.65.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby declared that the proportionate share of the cost of laying said water main of each parcel of the property fronting on said street as aforesaid is the amount set opposite to the description of each parcel or parcel of land below and that each piece or parcel of land is benefited by the laying of said water main to the full extent of the cost thereof, and that the respective amounts represent the proportionate benefits of the laying of said water main to the property described below and each of the same is hereby assessed and the amount set opposite each respective description for the cost of laying said water main.

Summary of Assessment for Water Main on Berkeley Way From East Main Street to Woodland Drive:

Notice of each parcel of property described in the foregoing Ordinance, as named therein, and in the Lien docket, and in the Ordinance as recorded in the Docket of City Liens: You are hereby notified that the assessment declared by the foregoing Ordinance has been made and the Lien therefor entered in the City Lien Docket, and that the same is due and you are hereby required to pay the same to the City Recorder within ten days from the service of this notice, which service is made by publication of the foregoing Ordinance and this notice one time in the Medford Mail Tribune, pursuant to an order of the City Council of said City.
