ONLY 4 COMMUNAZIS FOUND ON WPA ROLL ON QUESTIONNAIRE

Washington, July 12.—(AP)—The estimated thirty-odd thousand communists and nazis on work relief payrolls either abandoned their WPA jobs quietly before July 1 or falsified their party affiliations, officials concluded today.

Thus far, they said, a nationwide questionnaire poll of more than a million WPA workers has turned up only four persons acknowledging communist sympathies—two in New York, one in Detroit, and one in Philadelphia.

The poll was ordered under the 1940-41 relief act, which directed the dismissal by July 1 of all who answered that they were aliens, communists, nazis, or advocates of violent overthrow of the government.

JAPAN MOVES TO BLOCK INDO-CHINA TRADE GATE

Hongkong, July 12.—(AP)—The Japanese navy dispatched a dozen officers to Kwangchow, French-leased port midway between Hongkong and French Indo-China, today to block the remaining French-controlled inlet for trade destined for China.
