

### MEDFORD WOMEN TO AID REFUGEE BRITISH CHILDREN

Association University Women Helping Find Homes for War Threatened

Local branch of the American Association of University Women today extended its aid in the association's plan to provide homes for the children of members of the British Federation of University Women.

The Medford branch asked for a response from any reputable family financially able and willing to take care of a British child for the duration of the war. It was pointed out that "duration" might mean several years.

The British federation recently cabled the American association to inquire whether it could offer homes for children of British members. Within three days the American association had placements for 36 British children and since then additional branches have been enlisted in the plan.

The children, local officers explained, will be between the ages of 5 and 16. They will be brought in as speedily as possible under the British quota.

**Must Qualify**  
It was emphasized that one's means must be sufficient to take proper care of the child for possibly a long period of time, though it is not necessary to possess any great wealth. In some cities, one family provides the home and other families or a group of association members pay for the child's support. In this way, it was pointed out, the expense is spread and many persons, instead of one family, participate in the act of kindness.

### GOLDEN GATE FAIR IN EFFORT TO AID OREGON TOURISTS

Attractive Folder Carries Photographs of State's Scenic Spots; Given Free

A richly illustrated folder designed to attract travellers to Oregon is being distributed by the Golden Gate International exposition commission.

The folder is composed almost entirely of appealing photographs, half of it being devoted to Oregon, half to the exposition itself. It is being supplied in any desired quantity by the exposition commission without cost to anyone or any organization in Oregon, said the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce which is interested in its distribution.

Beginning Monday, the chamber of commerce will present copies of the folder to all of Medford's service clubs and to employers of large number of workers. Each member of the service clubs and each employee of the large firms will be asked to mail the folder to friends in other states so as to spread the information about Oregon's attractions in places where it will do the most good, the chamber of commerce explained.

In addition to making this organized effort at distribution, the chamber of commerce invites everyone to procure copies of the folder at its office and mail them to out-of-state residents who might thus be persuaded to visit Oregon. The chamber of commerce now has a supply of the folders and more may be procured from the exposition commission if needed.

The folder, done in the soft tones of lithography, is titled "Go Fairward Through Oregon." Scenes ranging from a lofty snow-capped mountain to a warm, sunny beach are shown on the front page. In the style becoming more and more popular, a map on the back page shows by illustrations what can be seen, done and produced in Oregon.

**Attractive Scenes.**  
On the central double page are pictures of Timberline lodge nestled in the snow on the slope of the majestic Mount Hood, the loading of lumber at the wharves of Portland, a typical highway winding leisurely through wooded hills, the new capitol at Salem, an interior of Oregon Caves and Crater Lake. Other pictures depict boating, skiing, fishing and picnicking. Arrangements for distributing the folders from Oregon cities are being made by Gordon Claycombe, former Ashland musician who now is assistant director of publicity and promotion for the exposition, and his Oregon assistant, Carl Werner of Portland.

A similar folder has been prepared for Washington and it was pointed out that visitors attracted to Washington by the international exposition would also have to pass through Oregon. Thus, it was emphasized, the Washington folders also will be of benefit to Oregon.
