## WALLACE CHOICE NOT POPULAR WITH COAST DELEGATES

Washington, Idaho Fought Naming — Oregon Delegates 'Go Along' With F.D.

Chicago, July 19.—(P)—Selection of Henry A. Wallace for the number two spot on the Democratic national ticket was not a popular choice with the majority of the Pacific northwest delegation to the national convention.

The delegations, which joined in making the vote unanimous last night, did so only after fighting to the end for other candidates.

Oregon cast its entire ten votes for Wallace, but Washington and Idaho delegates fought the pressure of Wallace groups to turn their support in other directions.

Willis Mahoney, Oregon state chairman, said his delegation decided to "go along with the president and his administration," after Louis Johnson had released the delegates.

Mahoney said his delegation was pleased with the planks on public power and "keeping war out of America" by strengthening defenses. The delegation, he said, was also pleased with the farm plank, which he said, helps farmers, orchardists, the dairy industry and cattle men.

## JAP FOREIGN MINISTER IS OREGON LAW SCHOOL GRADUATE, 1900 CLASS

Eugene, July 19.—(P)—Although he never attended classes on the Eugene campus, friends of Yosuke Matsuoka, a University of Oregon graduate who has been elevated to the position of Japanese foreign minister in Prince Fumimaro Kono's totalitarian cabinet, have followed his political activities with interest.
