

CCC PROGRAM TO GIVE WORK TO OREGONIANS

Over 11,000 Enrollees, Including 2,000 Oregon Youths in Oregon Forests

Washington, July 19.—(AP)—Oregon's conservation program will provide employment through the Civilian Conservation Corps for 2,000 Oregon young men.

James J. McEntee, director of the CCC, in announcing the figures today, said 56 camps would operate in this first quarter of the new fiscal year.

Of the 11,200 enrollees to be employed in Oregon, 5,200 will work on forest improvement, development and protection, 1,800 on range rehabilitation, 1,200 on reclamation projects, 1,000 under the supervision of the general land office, 800 in erosion control on agricultural lands, 600 on wildlife projects, 400 in state parks and 200 in Crater Lake national park.

McEntee said opportunity would be offered 581 Oregonians to enroll in the CCC during the present month as replacements for men who have left to accept private employment or whose enlistment period has expired.

NEW JAP CABINET WILL WORK WITH POWERS IN AXIS

Netherlands East Indies and French Indo-China Questions Still Unclassified

Tokyo, July 19.—(AP)—The inner government of the new Konoye cabinet reached a decision today on relations with Italy and Germany and informed quarters asserted that it calls for a closer working arrangement with the axis.

The question of whether the Netherlands East Indies and French Indo-China would be taken under "protection" still was unclassified.

It was considered certain that Japan first would attempt an understanding with Berlin on any action in the South Seas.

Premier Prince Fumimaro Konoye and the other three of his inner government—ministers of navy, war and foreign affairs—held a long conference in which they reviewed the entire field of proposed diplomatic policies.

Konoye said in an announcement tonight.

"I cannot at present announce details of the conference, but I can say that complete agreement was reached," he added.

Japan, under her new totalitarian-type government will remain friendly with the United

States, but will not lean over backward to improve this friendship, it appeared today.

The foreign office spokesman, Yakichiro Suma, told a press conference that Japan's desire for friendship with the United States would not be decreased, even though the new government strengthens relations with Germany and Italy.
