GERMANS REFUTE HOLLAND REPORT OF PEACE MOVES

Berlin, July 26.—(P)—German officials said today they were astonished that the Dutch Hilversum radio had broadcast yesterday the report of a peace mediation appeal to President Roosevelt on behalf of "the Netherlands committee for organization of an international peace conference at The Hague."

They said, moreover, that the recent speech of British Foreign Minister Lord Halifax, rejecting Adolf Hitler's reichstag peace offer, had closed all discussion of peace; therefore, any rumors of a new German offer are "too silly for an official rejoinder."

Private sources at Amsterdam said the organization mentioned in the radio broadcast was merely the hobby of one individual who had sent similar cables to heads of state even before May 10, the date of German entry into the low countries.

London, July 27.—(P)—It was stated officially today that the British government had received no German peace proposals via Stockholm. The statement was prompted by a report published in the United States, the King Gustav had been the intermediary for such proposals.

DIXIE DEMOCRATS MAY GET CHANCE TO VOTE WILKIE

Atlanta, July 27.—Wendell L. Wilkie's proposed third party was regarded today as an opportunity for southern Democratic supporters of the Republican presidential nominee to ease their voting consciences.

Wilkie sources in Colorado Springs, Colo., reported he was studying a new party as a means of permitting Democrats to vote for him without losing their party affiliation. Boiling Democrats lose party affiliation in some southern states.

So far as party disciplinary rules are concerned, observers agree there would be little theoretical difference in a Democrat voting for Republican or independent electors.

Wilkie-for-President clubs have been organized in several states of the traditionally Democratic south.

A group of Independent Democrats and Republican candidates started suit to force a secret ballot in South Carolina's general election. South Carolina voters, provided with a Democratic or Republican ballot by the party, are required to vote it straight.

A "Jeffersonian Democratic party," similar to one which Alabama Senator Thomas Helff organized after he was barred from the 1930 Democratic party following his campaign for the Hoover-Curtis ticket, was proposed in South Carolina. B. C. Allston Moore, Charleston, S. C., attorney, called a meeting next week to form the group to support Wilkie in South Carolina.

ALCATRAZ FELONS END DIET STRIKE

San Francisco, July 27.—(P) A strange, yet unexplained food strike at Alcatraz federal prison had ended today and all the convicts on "The Rock" were back on their usual rations after two weeks of self-imposed dieting.

Warden James A. Johnston said he was convinced the prisoners on the San Francisco bay island started the "strike" in hope of arousing public sympathy and, perhaps, of bringing about modification of the stern disciplinary rules there.

Segregation of suspected ring-leaders evidently was responsible for ending the diet-strike.

SEN. McNARY SETS AUG. 28 AS DATE OF NOTIFICATION

Salem, July 27.—(P)—The Oregon state fairgrounds, largest public gathering place in Salem, have accommodated 30,000 people at the annual fair and should prove ample in size for the crowds which will attend the ceremony of notifying Senator Charles L. McNary, August 28, of his nomination as Republican candidate for vice-president, Gov. Charles A. Sprague said today.

The notification will be held in the late afternoon.

The governor and J. D. Mickle, director of the department of agriculture and of the state fair, conferred here yesterday with Ralph H. Cake, Republican national committee man for Oregon.

Arrangements for the notification are being made by the national committee, the governor said.

The state fair grandstand will seat 7,500 persons. At least an additional 2,000 may be crowded into the plaza in front of the stand.

With the fair scheduled to open on September 2, the regular public address system will probably be available to carry the voices of the speakers at the notification ceremony throughout the spacious ground, the governor said.

MUSSOLINI RIDES TO SHOW HEALTH

Rome, July 27.—(P)—Premier Mussolini put his German cavalry mare over the hurdles today before 45 foreign correspondents that they might see how fit he is as he nears the end of his 56th year.

After 10 minutes of strenuous horsemanship the Duce reined in his mount, turned to a group of Nazi correspondents and asked in German: "Am I sick, weak, tired?"

His query required no answer. Mussolini, who will celebrate his birthday Monday, permitted the correspondents to view his early morning exercises on the vast, tree-shaded grounds of his Villa Torlonia residence in Rome.

I had asked about his daily routine as the leader of the Italian nation at war and it was in response to this query that the Duce admitted a selected group of correspondents to his home.

The correspondents were driven to Villa Torlonia in two buses provided by the ministry of popular culture. Nine Americans and 16 Germans were included in the party.
