

16 JACKSON BOYS LEAVING FRIDAY FOR BOYS' STATE

Past Commander Ebel of Legion to Accompany Lads on Trip—Will Hear Officials.

Sixteen Jackson county boys, 13 from the Medford area and three from Ashland, will leave by train at 8:05 p. m. Friday for the annual American Legion-sponsored Beaver Boys' state at the Hill Military academy in Portland. The youths will occupy a special car.

The camp will open Saturday and will continue for 10 days. Purpose of the camp is to teach American youths about government by permitting them to conduct the camp themselves in governmental form. The educational value of the camp is considered of especial importance this year because of the whitening away of democracies in other parts of the world.

Ebel To Accompany
R. R. Ebel, past commander of Medford post of the American Legion and Beaver Boys' state committee chairman, will accompany the group to Portland at the end of the camp to take the boys to the American Legion junior baseball finals in Hillsboro August 10 and 11 and to accompany them on the return trip.

The boys' sponsors, Legionnaires and others interested in the welfare of American youth are invited to the railroad station tomorrow evening to see the boys off.

The sponsors, who pay the boys' expenses, for the Medford youths are the Elks lodge, Rotary club, Active club, Medford American Legion post, United Spanish War Veterans, Odd Fellows lodge, J. C. The youths who apply for enrollment at the Beaver Boys' state must write an essay on democracy as one of the conditions of acceptance. A typical essay composed by one of the Medford boys follows:

"Our greatest inheritance is American citizenship. Because we are citizens of these United States of America, we have freedom of speech, freedom of religion and freedom of the press. We are a free people, living in a democracy where all men are equal. To preserve and guard this democracy of ours, we must be educated in the last detail to our system of government.

Greatest Inheritance
"While the privilege of American citizenship is our greatest inheritance, we can be of small value unless we are familiar with the complex form of running this country.

"Undoubtedly, Boys' State, with all of its instructive principles, offers us unlimited opportunities to learn the development of our government and the procedure by which our government operates.

"I am certain that the influence and guidance of Boys' State will prove to be a large factor in aiding me to become a worthwhile and an intelligent American citizen."

Among the scheduled talks at the camp is one by Gov. Charles A. Sprague. The boys will also hear supreme court justices, circuit court judges, college presidents and civic leaders.

Character-building influence and guidance will be offered by Bishop Benjamin D. Dagwell, Father Joseph Patrick Clancy and others. Bishop Bruce R. Baxter will direct the educational program.

MORE BRITISH YOUNG ARRIVE IN CANADA

An Eastern Canadian Port, Aug. 1.—(AP)—Hundreds of English children, bound for temporary homes in Canada and the United States, arrived here today on the third transatlantic liner docking this week.

Approximately 1,000 passengers were on board. Many of the adults were in service uniforms, among them Major-General R. Lafleche, former deputy minister of national defense, who recently served as Canadian liaison officer with the French general staff.

MORE JOBS LOCATED IN FIRST HALF YEAR

Salem, Aug. 1. (AP)—The state employment service found jobs for 62,371 persons during the first half of 1940, compared with 44,267 during the similar period of 1939.

Placements in private industry increased from 18,219 to 22,387, while supplementary placements, mostly in seasonal farm work, jumped from 16,727 to 25,024. Placements in public employment fell from 9,341 to 5,160.

TREASURE ISLAND MAY BECOME NAVAL STATION

San Francisco, Aug. 1.—(AP)—The site of the Golden Gate international exposition was envisioned by high naval officials

today as another possible bulwark of national defense. It was learned on unquestioned authority that the navy department in Washington has a recommendation from headquarters on the west coast that 400-acre Treasure island, built by the federal government at a cost of \$6,000,000, be acquired as a new base.
