

FORESTRY EXPERT EYES TREES HERE FOR INDUSTRY USE

Prof. Grondal Believes Some Trees Here Now Overlooked Could Be Profitable

"When a community pulls together you can get somewhere as Medford has done with its airport. When a community doesn't pull together, you are liable to be by-passed as Medford was by-passed by the Southern Pacific railroad."

Bror L. Grondal, professor of forestry at the University of Washington, Seattle, made this statement at a public luncheon-meeting sponsored by the directors of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce in the Hotel Medford this afternoon.

Mr. Grondal spoke about bringing new industries to Medford and stated he was here on invitation of Glenn L. Jackson, chamber of commerce president, to select samples of various kinds of woods to determine whether they are suitable in industries supplemental to the lumbering business. Mr. Grondal pointed out that various kinds of woods are now being

used in the manufacture of wood products, such as plywood and wood derivatives, such as plastics. The professor said it was his belief that species of trees now being overlooked in this locality as of no commercial value could be used profitably. At any rate, he added, the purpose of his visit was to find out. Samples of woods will be put through experiments in his laboratory, he said.

Must Tell World
To attract industries, the world must be told what raw materials, in quantity and quality are available, Mr. Grondal stated. There are other factors, too, however, in attracting industry, he added. Among these he included the attitude of the people of the community toward the industry, kind of labor available, amount of water available, accessibility of the raw materials and transportation facilities.

The professor ventured occasionally into politics, saying once that prospects for the fall were that investment of capital would be encouraged instead of being sent scurrying to cover.

Mr. Jackson presided. He presented William S. Bolger, former manager of the J. C. Penney store here, who returned with Mrs. Bolger to Medford for a vacation last night. Mr. Bolger is now a Penney manager in Yakima, Wash.
