

ANNUAL 4-H FAIR AT COURT HOUSE ON AUGUST 22-23

County Club Agent Francis
Announces Final Plans for
Exhibits and Contests

Final plans are being made for the county 4-H home economics fair which will be held in the courthouse auditorium, open to the public, August 22 and 23, L. E. Francis, county club agent, said today. Unusually active interest, said Mr. Francis, is being evidenced by club members and leaders in the fair, which provides classes for all of the divisions of cooking, sewing, canning, homemaking, room improvement, forestry and woodworking exhibits are also included in the fair.

Premiums are being offered for ten places in each class and it is anticipated that there will be at least 150 club members participating and more than 200 exhibits entered.

The fair this year is being sponsored for the first time by the Business and Professional Women's club of Medford, and one of the highlights of the fair will be the trophy which is being presented by the club as an award for the outstanding 4-H home economics club that participates in the fair. The award will be made on the following basis: Percent exhibiting 200 points, exhibit scores 100 points, judging 100 points, demonstration 100 points.

In addition to the regular classes there will be special contests in cooking, clothing and canning judging, style revue, bread baking and dollar dinner. These various activities offer the club members additional opportunity to participate in activities in connection with their projects. Each contest has as top award a trip to the state fair where the teams and individuals will represent Jackson county in statewide contests.

Judges for the 4-H home economics fair will be Miss Helen Cowgill, assistant state club leader, who will judge all exhibits, the style revue, the demonstrations and bread baking contest; and Mrs. Kenneth Fitzgerald, who will act as judge of the dollar dinner contest.

ORDER AIR FORCE TO FORT DOUGLAS

Hamilton Field, Marin County, Calif., Aug. 14.—(AP)—Col. John F. Curry, commanding officer of the U. S. army airbase here, today received orders to transfer practically his entire command to Fort Douglas, Utah, on September 1.

The order, amplifying previous announcements of the war

department, called for transfer of the seventh bombardment squadron of heavy bombers, the 88th reconnaissance squadron, and the fifth air base squadron, an administrative detail. In all, 169 officers and 1558 men were affected.

PROGRAM DRAWN FOR NOTIFICATION WENDELL WILLKIE

Festivities in Former Indiana
Home Town to Start at
10 A. M. Saturday.

Elwood, Ind., Aug. 14.—(AP)—Details of the program incident to Wendell L. Willkie's acceptance of the Republican presidential nomination Saturday were announced today.

The climax of the program comes at 3 p. m. (Central Standard Time) when Willkie is notified formally of his nomination by Rep. Joseph W. Martin, Jr., of Massachusetts, national chairman, and delivers his address of acceptance.

The day's festivities will begin at 10 a. m. with a four-hour entertainment in Callaway park, site of the acceptance.

Arrive at Noon.
The nominee and his party will arrive at noon by special train from Rushville, Ind. He is due to reach Rushville Thursday night and remain there until Saturday morning. He and Mrs. Willkie will visit her mother, Mrs. Cora Wilk, and he will probably visit his five farms in Rush county.

After Willkie's arrival here he will be greeted by members of the Summit American Legion post No. 19 of Akron, O., of which he was once commander.

Then the nominee's party will motor to the high school for a brief program. Mayor George M. Bonham will welcome Willkie and introduce Senator James J. Davis of Pennsylvania, former Elwood city clerk. Davis will introduce the nominee.

While the Willkie party proceeds to the park, members of the state ticket will be introduced there by Arch N. Bobbitt, Indiana G.O.P. chairman.

Halleck to Preside.
As Willkie reaches the speakers' platform at 3 p. m., a band will play "Back Home Again in Indiana."

Rep. Charles A. Halleck of Rensselaer, Ind., who nominated Willkie at the national convention, will preside. After Dr. William Lowe Bryan, president emeritus of Indiana university, pronounces the invocation, John

EASTERN OREGON AIR BASE SOUGHT

Salem, Ore., Aug. 14.—(AP)—Sen. Rufus Holman, R., Ore., today wired Secretary of State Earl Snell that the federal government would establish an air depot somewhere in the north-west east of the Cascades.

Snell presented the telegram to the board of control, the individual members of which pledged their personal aid in attempting to get the base for eastern Oregon.

At the present time California has four air bases, Washington has two and Oregon has none.

Holman's telegram did not say how much would be spent on the base but some of the board members said that they had heard the depot would comprise pursuit, bomber, supply and laboratory facilities.

More Japs Nabbed Off Pearl Harbor

Honolulu, Aug. 14.—(AP)—It was disclosed today that three more alien Japanese had been arrested yesterday within the

restricted defensive area off Pearl Harbor. This brought to 26 the number of such arrests, all fishermen, within the last six months.

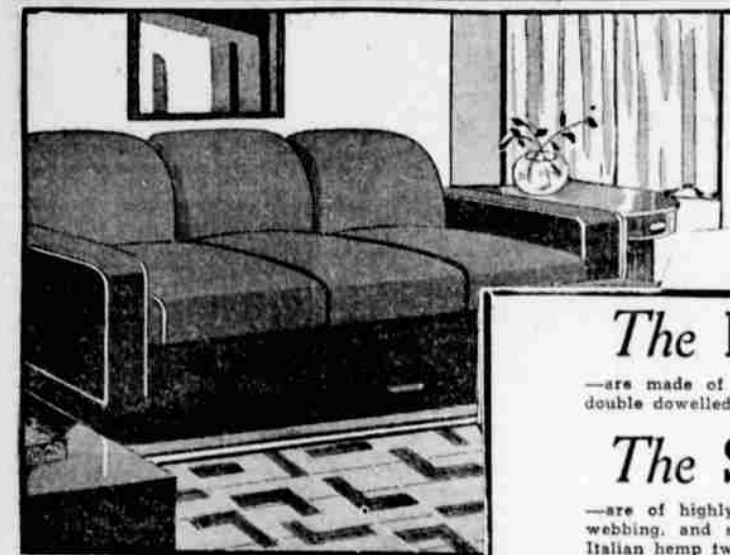
