Turkish Women Take Up Modern Styles of Dressing

Ankara (U.P.)—Future dress-makers of Turkey practice what they learn at the Ismet Inonu institute on no less a wardrobe than that of the country's first lady.

The wife of President Ismet Inonu is a leader in the movement to make Turkish women among the best dressed in the world. The Inonu institute is a super vocational school with an enrollment of 720. Its goal is to make Turkey self-sufficient in women's clothes.

In this school girls are trained to become teachers in the arts of embroidery, cooking, sewing, fashion design, millinery and pattern making. When they are graduated from the normal courses they are sent throughout the country to spread their learning.

It is all part of the Turkish republic's plan to make the country as modern and up-to-date as any American or Continental country. So far the institute has succeeded in gaining a reputation of being the Paris of Turkey. No Paris courtesan boasts more magnificent attelers and probably not as highly educated seamstresses. These students are forced to intermingle their study of the arts with history and geography and even some military science in event war becomes more important to Turkey than the latest fashion foibles.

Turkish women, who so recently discarded veils and harem trousers, will not be content for long with the cheap imported ready-to-wears which now flood the market. If the Ismet Inonu institute has its way, they will emerge among the best dressed women of the world.

SECRET SOCIETIES BANNED IN FRANCE

Vichy, France, Aug. 15.—(P) Dissolution of Freemasonry and other secret societies was extended to the German-occupied section of France, as well as the unoccupied region, by a decree published in the official journal today.

Penalties ranging up to two years in prison are provided for anyone guilty of contributing to the maintenance or reconstitution of the dissolved societies. If foreigners, they are to be expelled from France.

A preamble to the decree declared that "no government" could afford, "especially under the present circumstances," to permit the existence of groups pursuing secret activities.

GIBRALTAR REFUGEES ARRIVE IN PORTUGAL

Funchal, Madeira, Aug. 15.—(P)—Twelve hundred refugees from the British fortress of Gibraltar, including 778 women and 316 children, arrived at this Portuguese port today. (The dispatch did not give the nationalities of the refugees or their destination.)
