

JACKSON COUNTY WOMEN ORGANIZE TO FIGHT CANCER

Mrs. Ralph Boutelle Elected Chairman of Local Division of National Group

Plans for a sustained, energetic educational campaign against cancer in Jackson county were being carried forward today after the election of executives of a local division of the Women's Field Army of the American Society for the Control of Cancer.

At its second organization meeting, held Tuesday evening in the home of Mrs. Ralph U. Boutelle, of 21 Florence avenue, the Jackson county division elected Mrs. Boutelle chairman. Others elected were Mrs. L. E. Williams, vice chairman, Mrs. Robert Ingle of Ashland, secretary, and Mrs. Russell D. Davis, publicity chairman.

Advisory Board Named
Appointed to an advisory board were Mrs. J. C. S. Wells, president of the Jackson County Public Health association, and Dr. Robert W. Sleeter, Dr. Harvey A. Woods, Ashland, and Dr. O. J. Halboth, chosen by the Jackson County Medical society as its representatives.

Others attending the meeting Tuesday night were Mrs. T. E. Daniels, Mrs. Frances Cochran and Mrs. Margaret Henry.

Jackson county division of the Women's Field Army is sponsored by the Jackson County Public Health association and the Jackson County Medical society.

Systematic Campaign
Purpose of the army is to conduct a systematic campaign of education so that the public may become more intelligently informed regarding cancer—

how to recognize early signs of the disease, what steps to take and what pitfalls to avoid.
One of the stated objectives is: "To drive home to all intelligent persons that the control of cancer is a personal matter in that they must take the first step toward this control by asking the physician of their choice for a periodic medical examination and advice regarding further steps to be taken, if necessary."

apple and calery production because nearly all other produce shipments gained over the 1938-39 shipping year.

Pea shipments more than doubled over the preceding year's with 25 cars shipped out com-

pared with 11 carloads before. Cherry shipments were up 88 cars and there were also good increases in brine cherry, fresh prune and onion shipments.

Also doubling the 1938-39 figure were mixed fruits, with 239

cars certified as against 106 the previous year. Lettuce shipments increased 24 cars in the 1939-40 period.

Commodities certified during the year just closed but not on the list for the previous year

included fresh blackberries, 1.8 cars, pickling onions, 1.8 cars, avacados, 1 car, rhubarb, 3 cars, fresh loganberries, 8.4 cars, and cold pack black caps, 8 cars.

Potato shipments declined from 11,127 cars to 8,944 cars

and apples fell from 3,091 cars in 1938-39 to 1,660 cars in 1939-40. Only 43 cars of celery were shipped in the year just closed against 117 before. A slight decline in pear shipments was also listed.
