

HIKES TO TRACE RIVER'S SOURCE ARE SUGGESTED

Offered by Forest Service As Week-End Sidelights - Angling Now Spotty

The following bulletin was issued today by Rogue River National Forest headquarters: "Tracing the Rogue river to its source is one of the interesting forest sidelights for a week-end trip. It is suggested at this time when the berry season is almost over and good fishing is concentrated in only a few spots.

"The head of the Rogue river's south fork is reached by a 2 1/4 mile hike over the Blue Canyon trail. The trail leaves the road at Blue Rock, 20 miles from Butte Falls, and passes Round lake, where the hiker may stop for a refreshing swim, and Little lake and then on to Blue lake. Nearby are other lakes whose waters rush a canyon lined with cliffs and sub-alpine trees to form the south fork. All the lakes are well marked with directional signs and the forest officers at Butte Falls ranger station will furnish more specific information. The same area may be reached by an interesting saddle trip from Lake O' Woods where horses are available for rent.

For Ambitious Hikers Middle fork of the Rogue river heads in the Seven Lakes basin, providing a trip for more ambitious hikers. Cars may be parked three miles east of Lodgepole guard station from where it is eight miles to the basin by steep but well-graded trail. From Seven lakes it is but an hour's climb to Devil's Peak lookout for an inspiring view of the Cascade divide, the Lake basin and Klamath lake. Another route to Seven lakes is by a two-day trip from Blue Canyon, along the Skyline Trail and past Island lake. Campfire permits for this area may be obtained at the Butte Falls ranger station or from forest guards at Lodgepole or Imnaha.

"The source of the Rogue river's north fork is Boundary springs, on the boundary between Crater Lake National Park and Rogue River National Forest. It is within one mile of the Diamond Lake highway above Union Creek. There is no trail to the springs and while it is possible to reach it by hiking along the river, the going is rough in spots. Forest officers at Union Creek ranger station will give detailed directions for this trip, as well as to point out many other beautiful spots on the many small streams in this vicinity which are tributaries of the north fork and which are easily accessible by road.

Rides in Moonlight "At Lake O' Woods, with the moon turning full this week-end, an interesting and popular thing to do will be to ride horseback around the moonlit lake. Nights are cool and pleasant and the forest and lake are at their scenic best in the moonlight. A guide always accompanies these night rides so that the most inexperienced riders may go safely. A short but interesting hike from Lake O' Woods may be made up the Fourmile diversion ditch where in about three miles the hiker sees down on Lake O' Woods and cross-country at Klamath lake, the Mountain Lakes wilderness area and south to Mt. Shasta.

"Fishing during the past week has been poor in most small streams. Fourmile lake has been good for silversides, fishing with cluster eggs, and fair for eastern brook and rainbow by trolling or fly fishing. Ginko and Mill creeks in the Union Creek district offer good fishing with flies or grasshoppers; both are brushy streams. South fork and middle fork of Rogue river are good for fly fishing with yellow-bodied gray hackles. Seven lakes, Blue Canyon lakes and Sky lakes are only fair, with deep fishing with worms the best.

Warning on Fires "In the Rogue river from Prospect to Grants Pass trout fishing continues to be excellent at all points in spite of low water. The best flies are willow, golden dunn and water cricket; best time is in the late evening. The steelhead are increasing slowly with a few more each week but nothing in comparison with former years. It is hoped that the present cool nights may bring the long anticipated summer run. Parmachene belle and beaver kill flies and small spinners are bringing the best catches of steelhead.

"Low humidity this week-end makes the fire hazard critical. Forest visitors are urged to be particularly careful to smoke only while stopping in a safe place, to build only small campfires and to extinguish them completely with water."
