

# VAST FREE ESTATE FOR PUBLIC'S USE IN U. S. FORESTS

National Timber Lands Offer Country Place to Mr. and Mrs. America

Washington—Imagine owning a 176,000-acre country place these asphalt-melting days. Well, that's just the size of your cool, green estate in the national forests, Mr. and Mrs. America.

No matter where you live, your free woodland retreat is no more than half a day away in the family jalopy. There are national forests in 35 of the 48 states.

There's a standing invitation from the U. S. forest service to use your wildwood hideaway any time. Thousands of forest rangers and forest service employees are ready to help.

Name your preference—cool woods, streams, lakes, mountains—there's a spot for you

to meet the most critical specifications for an outdoor vacation.

**Want a Summer Home?**  
You even can get land for a permanent summer home in many national forests for a \$15-\$25 annual rental.

The greatest good to the greatest number is the basic rule of U. S. forest management. The choicest spots for camping are reserved for the general public, and facilities for recreation have been set up there.

The next most desirable spots are set aside for group recreation sites—such as 4-H club camps and civic group camps for underprivileged children.

Then, in certain areas where there is plenty of space beyond the needs of the general public and community public, the forest service leases sites for summer homes to individuals, at nominal rentals. Thousands of these low-cost, rustic cottages dot the national forests.

**Want To Rough It?**  
In addition to the recreation centers, there are vast tracts of virgin country which have been set aside for the hardy who want to rough it. There are no roads, no facilities—just pack trails and nature at her wildest.

For the more effete there are some swank inns, such as Timberline Lodge on Mount Hood, Ore. They are operated like other vacation inns, and cost about the same.

But the facilities of the average recreation camp are free. Uncle Sam provides cooking facilities, camp sites and supervision. Bring your own blankets and grub and your tent and have yourself a time.

After all, it belongs to you and you and you, a 176,000-acre estate a millionaire could not begin to buy.

## THANKSGIVING TO BE DAY FDR. PICKS

Salem, Aug. 23.—(P)—If President Roosevelt designates November 21 as Thanksgiving day, Oregon will follow suit. Governor Charles A. Sprague said today.

The president said last year, when he asked governors to set the day a week earlier, that he would make a similar request in 1940. This year's Thanksgiving ordinarily would be November 28.

Last year about half the governors obeyed the president's request.

Governor Sprague said a year ago there would be two Thanksgiving days in November, 1940. The first, he said, would be on election day when the country would be thankful for the election of a Republican president, and the second would be the turkey day.

In Oregon there would be legal holidays in three successive weeks. They will be election day on November 5, armistice day on November 11, and Thanksgiving day on November 21.
