That said mortgage be foreclosed in the manner provided by law upon that said defendant and all persons claiming by, through or under them, be forever foreclosed of all right, title, interest and claim in and to said real property.

That upon such foreclosure said property be sold as by law provided and the proceeds applied to the liquidation of Plaintiff's said mortgage, the note secured thereby, that certificate of sale be issued and the purchaser put into possession of said premises.
