

JACKSON COUNTY 4-H BOYS, GIRLS OFF TO FAIR SOON

Local Members to Display Work and Enter Contests at Annual Salem Event

Lawrence E. Francis, Jackson county 4-H club agent, will leave Sunday for Salem with 20 exhibits to be entered in the annual state fair September 2 to 8 by local 4-H boys and girls.

Mr. Francis will arrange the exhibits and make other preparations for the arrival and stay in the capital of ten Jackson county 4-H members who will exhibit at the fair as winners of various honors at home during the past year. The 20 exhibits pertain to home economics. In addition there will be an exhibit of sheep in the livestock division and three boys, Bob Damon, Merton Bradshaw and Clayton Charley, all of the Lake Creek 4-H club, will compete in the judging of livestock.

The ten exhibitors, who will leave for the fair in the next few days, are Joan Denny and Hazel Saltmarsh, Oak Grove 4-H club, Doris Hunsley and Jean Brenne-sholtz, Table Rock, Gwendolyn and Janet Charley, Lake Creek, Virginia Ricks, Howard, Cora Bigham and Patty von der Hel-len, Antelope, and Twila Ferns, Fern Valley, Miss von der Hel-len will exhibit the sheep. The home economics exhibits com-prise cooking, sewing, canning and wood working.

Also To Compete
The girls will also compete in cooking, canning, clothing judging, bread making and style modeling. The Charley girls will enter as a team in the national dairy foods demonstration con- test, winner of which will go to Harrisburg, Pa., to represent Oregon in the national finals.

The Jackson county exhibi- tors and contestants are going to the state fair fresh from the county-wide 4-H economics fair held last Thursday and Friday in the courthouse auditorium here under sponsorship of the Medford Business and Profes- sional Women's club.

Trophy Winner
The Lake Creek Cooking club won the trophy put up as the major award by the business and professional women's group. The trophy will be in competition each year with the name of the winning club to be inscribed thereon. It will become the per- manent possession of the club winning it three consecutive years. In that event, the wom- en's club will provide another trophy. Mrs. Claire Trueblood, leader of the Lake Creek Cook- ing club, accepted the trophy for the club from Mrs. Maude Sni- der, spokesman for the business and professional women's group.

There were 120 exhibitors and 200 exhibits in the county home economics fair. Winning cham- pionship ratings were Joan Denny, sewing; Virginia Ricks, cooking; Patty von der Hel-len, canning; Ben Welch, wood work- ing; and Robert Shelby, forestry.

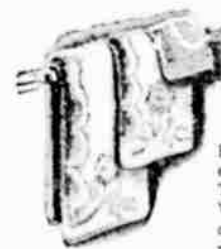
