

ASHLAND COUNCIL HELPS 'SWEETEN' GUARD MESS FUND

\$100 Voted As Nucleus of Fund to Be Administered by Proposed Association

Ashland, Sept. 5.—(Spl.)—This city's national guardsmen today were assured of little extra conveniences during their year's service at camp. They also looked forward to a grand military ball which citizens are planning as a gala send-off for the soldiers before they depart for camp.

The city council Tuesday night appropriated \$100 as the nucleus of a "mess" fund to be administered by the Coast Artillery association which is to be organized here to provide home support and contact for the guardsmen of Ashland's battery B, coast artillery, while they are at camp. The men will leave for Camp Clatsop September 23 after mobilization September 16.

Contributors Members
The Coast Artillery association will have as its officers and members those who contribute to the "mess" fund, in whatever amount. Cards will certify memberships. The fund will be used to provide the soldiers with extra comforts and conveniences which would not be possible with their meager pay and the limited army mess appropriations, it was explained.

The ball will probably be held in the armory during the week of September 16. Proceeds from the ball will go to the "mess" fund.

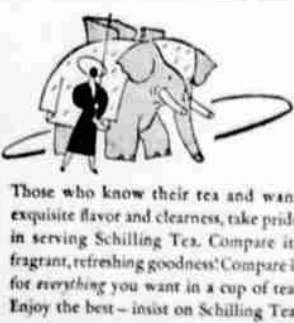

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THREE MARRIAGES RUN ON ROCKS AT CINEMA CAPITAL

Hedy Lamarr, Carole Landis and John Barrymore Would Drop Marital Ties

Hollywood, Sept. 5.—(AP)—Anti-marital tidings from the film colony:

Beauteous, black-haired Hedy Lamarr is suing Writer-Producer Gene Markey for divorce. The veteran thespian-ironclad John Barrymore, and his young wife, Elaine Barrie, have "busted up" again. Blonde Carole Landis has left her wealthy, socially-connected yacht broker husband, Willis Hunt, planning an early divorce suit.

In her brief complaint, Miss Lamarr charged she had been subjected to "grievous mental and physical suffering" but omitted details.

Miss Lamarr and Markey, former husband of Actress Joan Bennett, married at Mexicali, Mexico, March 4, 1939. They met soon after she came to Hollywood and divorced Fritz Mandl, Austrian munitions maker. Mandl was reported to have objected strenuously to her nude appearance, at 17, in the European film, "Ecstasy," which was barred for a time in the United States and later released.

Barrymore Unhappy

Barrymore, the rabelaisian, pungent "old man river" of the stage and screen, declared he and his 25-year-old fourth wife are separated permanently this time. In previous rows, she has started and then dropped two divorce suits and he has abandoned actions against her and her mother, one involving his money.

At his Beverly Hills mansion, which auction sale customers once refused to buy, Barrymore said he left Elaine at their Bel-Air home a week ago.

"Neither of us is to blame," he said. "I came to the realization that we'd both be happier, so I beat it."

"I just don't like cul-de-sacs. Emotionally, spiritually and psychologically my life was leading me nowhere. We just didn't get along and I thought we'd be happier away from each other."

HIGH SCHOOLS TO REOPEN MONDAY

All the high schools and, with one possible exception, all the rural schools will start next Monday, the county school superintendent's office said today. The possible exception is Clatsop, which to date has not reported the opening day.

Ten high schools, as follows, will start: Prospect, Gold Hill, Rogue River, Jacksonville, Central Point, Eagle Point, Butte Falls, Ashland, Talent and Medford.
