La Guardia Urges Home Guard Plan

Washington, Sept. 6.—(AP)—Mayor LaGuardia of New York urged congress today to authorize a system of "home guards" throughout the United States, with the federal government supplying arms, uniforms and general supervision. LaGuardia, wartime filer and member of the newly-appointed United States-Canadian defense board, testified before the senate military committee in support of a bill sponsored by Chairman Sheppard (D-Tex.)
