

ENLISTMENT DRIVE OPENS FOR LOCAL NAT'L GUARD UNITS

the compliments of the people of Medford. There are, however, other and more desirable things for which a company fund might be used, the captain said.

Contributions Received
While it was indicated that the bulk of the fund will be provided by business houses, contributions will be received from the public in general. Contributions may be left at the chamber of commerce.

Capt. Tengwald and 1st Lieut. James W. Grigsby, commanding headquarters detachment, had been invited to the committee meeting to explain the needs of their units and the advantages of enlisting now.

Tengwald Commands Co. A.

Capt. Tengwald said: Young men who enlist now will go to camp for a year with officers and men they know; they will have a start on the men who wait for conscription; with this start, they should be able to advance to non-commissioned ratings as the army is increased under the national defense plan; a night school, with highly qualified instructors, will be maintained for those who want to continue their studies and full high school credits will be granted.

While stating, however, that many opportunities will be available for study and advancement, Capt. Tengwald emphasized that in the last analysis "it is up to the boy himself." If the boy applies himself and shows an interest in his work, he will be given every encouragement to advance, the captain said, but he counseled that success will depend entirely upon the youth himself.

tor of the Presbyterian church and chairman of the defense committee, commented that the night school was a highly desirable feature of army life at camp. He inquired whether employers here had given any assurance that their jobs would be held for the men who go to camp. Capt. Tengwald replied

that the Rogue River Valley Traffic association had told him that packing house jobs would be available for the employees of any member firms and that the California Oregon Power company and some other employers had assured him that jobs would be kept for employees who enlisted. The captain added

that few of the national guardsmen had regular jobs. In response to an inquiry from the chairman, Capt. Tengwald explained that men who enlist in the national guard now will be placed on the inactive list until the day of mobilization when they will go on the active list and prepare to go to

camp for a year's duty; that the enlistment will be for three years; that under present regulations there will be no discharges until six months after the return to home stations from camp; that enlistment now relieves the recruit from conscription. The captain added that probably, unless a new emergency arose, the recruits would be discharged soon after the return from camp as he thought the units then would be reduced to normal size.

May Raise Pay

The pay is now \$21 a month but if the pending conscription bill is passed it will be raised to \$30, Capt. Tengwald related. He added that all food, shelter, clothing and medical and dental services are provided without cost.

Howell B. Murphy commented that with so many advantages to enlistment now and no apparent disadvantages, there should be no difficulty in attaining the objectives of the campaign.

It was voted to send statements of the objectives of the campaign to each service club in Medford.

Dr. Divine appointed the following sub-committees: consultation, Capt. S. M. Tuttle, Mr. Murphy and Diamond Flynn; fund, Gain Robinson, Mr. Flynn and Frank DeSouza; and publicity, Lloyd Williamson, Capt. H. J. Meiring, Merrill A. Beneka and Capt. Tuttle.

The meeting was adjourned to 8:00 p. m. Monday.

391 LICENSES ISSUED HERE SINCE MEDICAL EXAMINATION DECREED

Marriage records of the county clerk's office show 391 licenses have been issued in Jackson county since the Oregon medical examination-marriage law went into effect. From December, 1938 to December, 1939, a thirteen month period, 212 licenses were issued. For the eight months of the current year, the total was 179.

The 1940 boom in romance started last May, with 29 licenses issued. June, the marrying month, had 35, July 26 and August 35.

The score for the first four months of this year stands: January 14, February 11, March 13, and April 16.

The 1938-1939 issuance was: December, 1938, six; January, 1939, seven; February, seven, March 13, April 10, May 19, June 18, August 24, September 24, October 19, November 31 and December 18.

The first six months of 1939 saw many Jackson county couples journeying to California, chiefly Yreka, for marriage licenses.
