

41ST DIVISION TO COMPLETE MOVE TO CAMP SEPT. 23

Motor Trucks and Trains to Carry Oregon Troops — Recruiting Going Well

Salem, Sept. 11.—(P)—Concentration of troops of the 41st division in the Fort Lewis-Camp Murray area will be completed by Monday, September 23, General George A. White, division commander, said today.

Troops will be mobilized Monday and some elements, including advance detachments and service troops, will report to the Puget Sound camp by Friday of next week.

Motor trucks and trains will carry Oregon troops to the concentration camp, while at the same time divisional troops from all over the northwest begin a converging movement. Tables for movement of 13,000 officers and men are now being prepared by General White.

Recruiting, proceeding rapidly, is expected to bring the division to its peacetime strength of 13,000.

Active training will start immediately on arrival at the Washington camps.

ANSWER IS FILED BY HOTEL OWNERS

Answer was filed yesterday by Niedermeyer, Inc., Callie Palm and Mary Wolfe, in the \$25,000 damage suit filed against them by Harry Lewis, as the result of a fall down the Lake hotel stairs, last March, in which he sustained an injured hip. The case has been set for trial late this month.

The plaintiff alleges the fall was the result of the stairway not being properly protected and lighted.

The upper floor of the building at West Main and Grape streets is used as a hotel. It is owned by Niedermeyer, Inc., and Callie Palm. Mary Wolfe is the landlady.

The answer holds the fall was

due to Lewis not exercising due care and caution in traveling the stairs and, furthermore, as a resident of the hotel for some time previous to the accident, had full knowledge of their condition and assumed any and all risks arising.
