

SOLICITOR CURB IS PLANNED BY ASHLAND C. OF C.

Ashland, Sept. 12.—(Sp.)—Ashland Chamber of Commerce directors have approved a plan to curb activities of so-called "transient solicitors" and others who, the directors say, annually take out hundreds of dollars from the community in various advertising schemes and leave

no material or financial returns. Patterned after policies now in force in Medford, Klamath Falls and other southern Oregon cities, the plan would require all solicitors to secure the approval of a secret committee of the Chamber of Commerce before launching their activities. Dean Pieper, chamber secretary, was instructed to put the plan into effect. Information on solicitors who make a practice of "working a circuit" of cities will be inter-changed with chambers which have adopted the project.

C. M. Litwiler, president of the chamber, lauded the move and urged co-operation on the part of the merchants in assuring its success. He added that if the businessmen get behind the action it will result in a noticeable decrease in the number of solicitors and promoters who attempt to "high-pressure" businessmen.

The directors also recommend that G. M. Green, chairman of the highway committee, consult

with officials towards endorsement of the Tiller-Trail road project. Funds for this highway are provided through the forestry department, it was stated. It is expected that Green and other chamber members will be present at the coming meeting and will present the Ashland stand at that time.

TAKE FINGERPRINTS OF ASHLAND ARTILLERYMEN

Ashland, Sept. 12.—(Sp.)—Mass fingerprinting of the enlisted personnel of Battery B-249th Coast Artillery leaving this month for Fort Stevens, has been completed in conjunction with the local police department, Captain H. B. Bentley said today.

Prior to its induction into federal service, the enlisted personnel of the outfit was "printed" only for state records but the Army demands prints on its own forms and in accordance with its own regulations, Captain Bentley said.

EX-MEDFORDITES GET MENTION IN U.P. PUBLICATION

Two former Medford newspaper reporters who now are United Press bureau managers are singled out for comment in the news gathering association's current monthly bulletin. They are Richard C. Applegate, Salem bureau manager, and Arthur L. Schoeni, bureau manager at Olympia, Wash.

Describing United Press coverage of Sen. Charles L. McNary's acceptance speech at Salem, the bulletin says: "For speedy distribution, United Press operated a special leased wire from the fairgrounds to

the San Francisco U.P. bureau, kept the coverage of Salem Manager Richard C. Applegate and Portland Manager J. F. Gale moving at top speed."

The bulletin also tells of the widespread newspaper use of coverage which Schoeni organized for reporting the maneuvers in the Puget Sound area by the regular army and the national guard. The bulletin says:

"Biggest thrill for Schoeni was when two 'enemy' warplanes mistook his observation plane for a foe and 'attacked.' Schoeni unlimbered his big press camera and methodically shot 12 pictures of the 'attackers' power-diving on his plane. "Biggest disappointment came in the darkroom where he discovered he'd forgotten to pull the slide from the camera, had 12 blank negatives."
