

ASSIGNMENTS FOR 24 MEN, 8 GIRLS OPENED BY N. Y. A.

New Part-Time Work Program Approved—Register at Employment Office

Assignments are available for 24 young men and eight young women, age 17 to 24 inclusive, on newly approved projects of the National Youth Administration at Medford. It was announced by Earl I. Rice, NYA area director, today. These assignments offer part-time work-experience for eligible young men and women in clerical and stenographic work and in shop work, sheet metal work, welding, carpentry, cabinet making, drafting and surveying for young men.

Mechanical and clerical aptitude tests are given to applicants as a basis of selection for assignment. Exclusive of compensated hours, all applicants are required to engage in regular classes of training related to project work. By periodic aptitude tests applicants must show constant improvement in associated occupational skills.

Should Register
Unmarried persons, age 17 to 24 inclusive, who are in need of employment, work-experience or training, are eligible to register, provided they are United States citizens. Preliminary steps of NYA registration can be completed at the Oregon state employment office in the Holland Hotel building, after which the applicant will be referred to the NYA area office in the Jackson county court house, for aptitude test appointments. Rural youths can make preliminary application by mail, directed to the NYA area office.

Full Time Available
Full-time assignments to NYA resident projects are available to youths who are interested in a more intensified work-training program away from home, under supervised living conditions, where the worker earns enough to provide subsistence, medical care, and tuition, with a reasonable amount for personal expenditures.

Young men who desire to attend the Eugene Vocational school and who are interested in cooking, commercial designing, auto mechanics, aviation mechanics, radio or other technical courses should make application now for full term assignment.

CIVIL SERVICE EXAMS SLATED

Because of the national defense program there is an urgent demand for instructors in the air corps technical school of the war department, the U. S. civil service commission said today in announcing a number of examinations.

The examinations announced were:
Instructor, air corps technical school, \$3,800 a year; associate instructor, \$3,200 a year; assistant instructor, \$2,600 a year; and junior instructor, \$2,000 a year.

Other examinations were announced for the following positions:

Senior and junior stenographer and senior and junior typist, for men only, to fill vacancies in the field service in Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Washington.

Personnel technician, in various grades with salaries ranging from \$4,600 a year to \$2,000 a year.

Helper, electrician and helper, core drill operator, bureau of reclamation, Coulee dam, Wash.

Complete information about these and other pending examinations may be procured at Medford postoffice from Stanley G. Sherwood, acting secretary of the local board of civil service examiners.
