

DR. GLENN FRANK AND SON KILLED IN AUTO SMASHUP

Noted Educator, Author and G. O. P. Adviser Loses Life On Eve of Election

Greenleaf, Wis., Sept. 16.—(AP)—Dr. Glenn Frank, 52, Republican political adviser, educator, and author, was killed in an automobile accident last night on the election eve of his first campaign for public office. His son, Glenn Frank, Jr., 21, a newspaper reporter, was fa-

tally injured and a publicity aide suffered minor injuries. Dr. Frank, chairman of the Republican party's policy committee, was seeking the U. S. senatorial nomination in tomorrow's Wisconsin primary election. **Smashup On Curve** Enroute from one political gathering to another, Frank's automobile failed to round a curve at a road intersection, crashed into a sand pile, and overturned. Dr. Frank was killed instantly. His son died on the way to a hospital at Green Bay. Theodore Stumpf, 23, of Waukegan, a member of Frank's campaign publicity staff, was burned by acid let loose by the automobile's campaign sound equipment. Suffering from shock, Stumpf could give only a meager account of the accident. **Had Attended Picnic** Dr. Frank had attended a

political picnic at Stoughton during the afternoon and was on his way to a Green Bay hotel for dinner with Republican leaders when the accident occurred. In Kansas City last night Wendell Willkie said he was "greatly shocked" to learn of Frank's death. **PORTLAND'S BUDGET SET AT \$6,144,473** Portland, Sept. 16.—(AP)—A \$6,144,473 budget for 1941 was approved by the city council today. Johnson, 56, The Dalles, was recovered from the Columbia river six miles west of here yesterday by a searching party. Dr. Johnson fell from his yacht Annabelle and drowned last Wednesday.

PAPER SHIPMENT BURNS IN SALEM

Salem, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Loss in the fire last night which destroyed the Salem Navigation company's warehouse was placed today at \$229,000 by company officials. It was fully insured. About 1,500 tons of paper, valued at \$225,000 and consigned by the Oregon Pulp and Paper co., of Salem to all parts of the world was destroyed. Firemen were unable to determine cause of the blaze, but the company management said it probably was started by transients who have been sleeping in the building.
