

110,300 TONS OF BRITISH SHIPPING DOWNED BY NAZIS

Berlin Acknowledges Ace U-Boat Skipper Given Up for Lost With His Craft

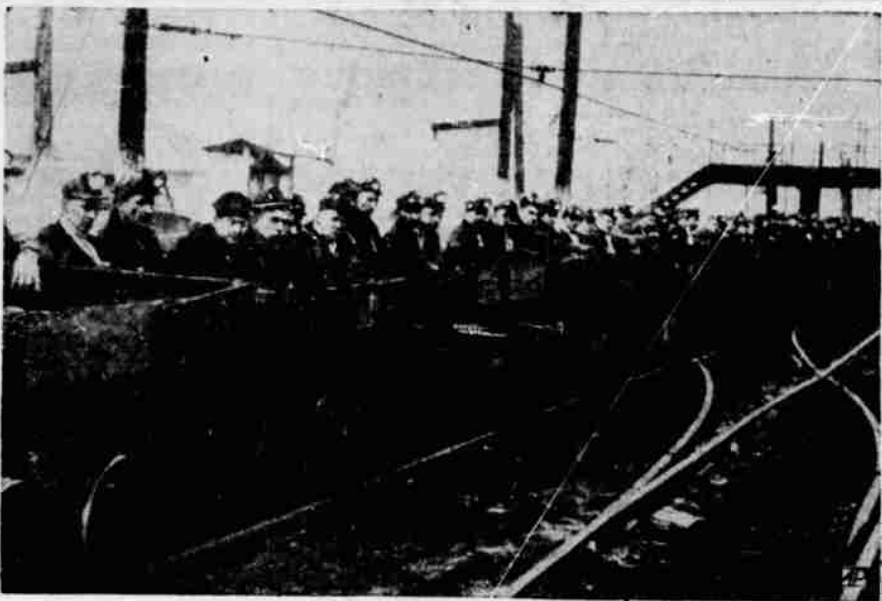
Berlin, May 23.—(AP)—German submarines have sent 110,300 tons of British shipping to the bottom of the Atlantic in recent operations, the Nazi high command asserted today, but it acknowledged that Germany's ace U-boat commander, Guenther Prien has been given up for lost with his ship.

Nine of the British ships sunk were picked out of one convoy bound for England, the war bulletin said, and accounted for 70,900 tons.

Among them, it listed three tankers of 8,000, 10,000 and 13,000 tons and a "heavily laden munitions steamer of 7,000 tons."

Another 18,000 tons of merchant shipping was said to have been sunk by submarines in lone attacks and, in waters west

of Africa, submarines sank 21,400 tons, the communiqué said. The losses inflicted off the African coast were said by other sources also to have been sunk out of a convoy. These also credited air attack with sinking a 5,000-ton merchant vessel.

FRENCH DESERT TO BRITISH SIDE

Damascus, Syria, May 23.—(AP)—A French commander and 200 volunteer soldiers have deserted to the British in Palestine and Trans-Jordan after a fight with frontier guards in which a few were killed and wounded on both sides, it was announced officially tonight.

The commander was Colonel Collet. Authorities denied, however, that the De Gaulist (Free French) troops had entered Syria or that regular French troops in Syria under General Henri Dentz were retiring. Such reports had been broadcast by the De Gaulists from Equatorial Africa.

BRIDGES FAILS TO SUBPOENA PERKINS

San Francisco, May 23.—(AP)—A futile plea was made today for subpoenas to force Secretary of Labor Perkins and Major Lemuel Schofield, chief of the department of immigration and naturalization, to appear as defense witnesses at the deportation hearing of Harry Bridges.

Mrs. Carol King, a defense attorney, told Examiner Charles B. Sears that she wanted to bring out from these witnesses that the CIO longshore leader was being singled out for persecution.

Examiner Sears said he had no authority to subpoena the three officials or to subpoena documents the government holds in the case, which Mrs. King also asked.

Trains Collide. Bend, Ore., May 23.—(AP)—A locomotive was derailed, several logs were shattered and a portion of track torn up here yesterday when a Great Northern gravel train struck the rear of a logging train near here. Crews of both trains escaped injury.

DUTCH EAST INDIES UNDAUNTED BY JAP NEWSPAPER THREATS

Batavia, Netherlands East Indies, May 23.—(AP)—A newly-launched Japanese press campaign bristling with threats and pointed warnings will not force The Netherlands East Indies from their firm stand in commercial negotiations with Japan, informed quarters asserted today.

Furthermore, these informants said that a Japanese commercial program as outlined by the Tokyo press with reference

to the N.E.I. was considered largely unacceptable here. The four-month-old commercial negotiations were declared to have entered a critical stage with the exchange of final memoranda earlier this month. The main stumbling block has been the disinclination of the N.E.I. to sell large quantities of vital products to Japan, lest they find their way to Germany.

The launching of the violent press campaign, one informed source said, may mean the beginning of preparations to prepare the Japanese public for a breakdown in the negotiations.

AIR FLEET BOOST WILL BE SOUGHT

Washington, May 23.—(AP)—The war department will soon ask congress, informed quarters said today, for a \$2,500,000,000 appropriation for a new "security fleet" of 13,000 bombing and fighting planes part of which will be ready for action in about 18 months.

As outlined by defense officials, the 13,000-plane program would be superimposed on the present 21,000 army goal, as well as other undisclosed additions already proposed in the regular military appropriations

bill now pending before a house committee.

Interested legislators said they had been assured that plane deliveries would be in full swing 18 months after construction start d.
