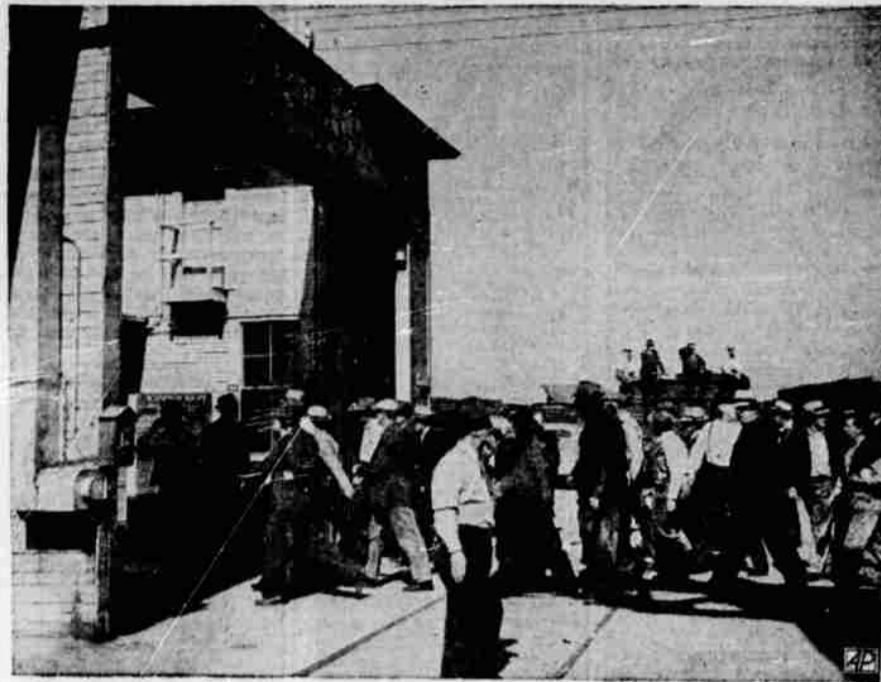
FOREST SERVICE OFFICIALS MEET

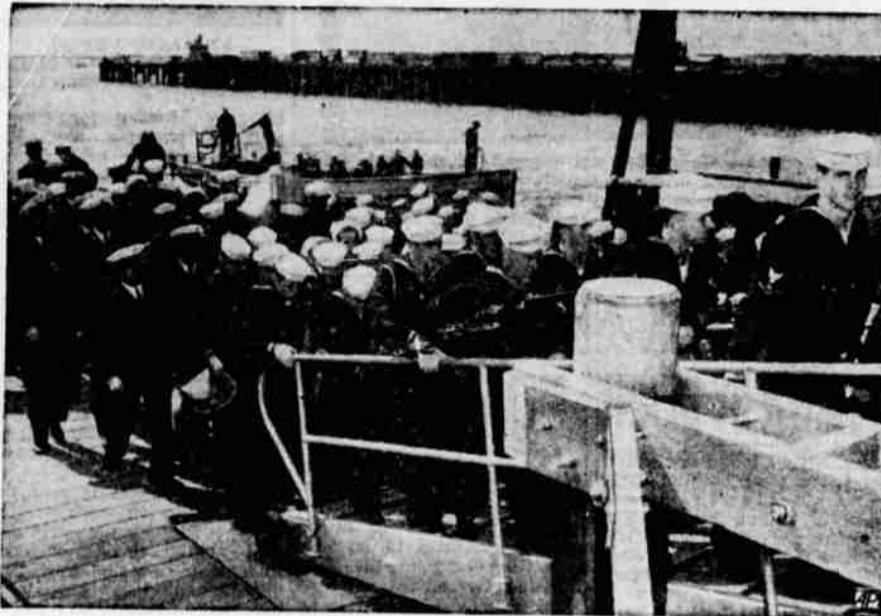

\$46,549 BID WINS TILLER-TRAIL JOB

Portland, May 23.—(P)—Contracts on five projects totaling

\$437,000 were awarded yesterday by the state highway commission. Two bids totaling \$88,000 were referred to engineers and two rejected.

L. H. Hoffman's low bid of \$78,000 for remodeling the Morrison bridge approaches and building harbor retaining walls in Portland was rejected, along with a \$51,836 bid by Porter

W. Yett, also of Portland, on a Hood River county grading, surfacing and oiling project.

Contracts awarded included: Douglas: Grading, surfacing and oiling 4.3 miles, Days Creek-Wright ranch section of Tiller-Trail highway. E. L. Rigdon, Hampton, \$46,549.

Two projects will be investigated, one a proposal to widen Sixth street in Klamath Falls, the other the Crater Lake highway north of Medford. The possibility that an army cantonment might be built north of Medford raised the question of whether projected improvements would be adequate.

GEN. GUZZONI IS DEMOTED BY DUCE

Rome, May 23.—(P)—General Alfredo Guzzoni was dropped today as vice chief of the Italian general staff and undersecretary of war.

A communique said Division General Antonio Scuro, general superintendent of the Italian army in Albania, had replaced him as undersecretary of war and that the general staff job had been eliminated.

No reason was given for the change, the communique saying merely that Premier Mussolini had written Guzzoni a letter thanking him for his services in the two jobs.

Kiln Foreman Killed
Reedsport, Ore., May 23.—(P)—F. G. Cramer, 53, dry kiln foreman at the Winchester Bay Lumber Company mill here, was fatally injured this morning. Pinned underneath a loading dry kiln car which tipped, he died en route to a hospital.
