Grant in Role of Reporter—Sparkling Romance Acclaimed by Critics.

Reunited in "Penny Serenade," Irene Dunne and Cary Grant return to the Craterian theatre screen today for three days. HIGH COMMANDER NAZI AIR FORCE DIES IN ACTION

Berlin, May 24 — (P) — Germany announced today the death of Col.-Gen. Ulrich Grauert, one of her highest ranking air commanders, while "leading the fight against England."

Grauert, the leader of the flying corps which has borne the brunt of the air attacks on Britain and the battle of Dunkerque, "met a hero's death," the high command said. The place and circumstances were not mentioned, but there were unofficial indications he might have been killed some days ago, before the aerial invasion of Crete began.

Some informants asserted positively that his death was not connected with the Crete attack, mentioned for the first time today by the high command.

(The only intense air action in which a flying corps com-

mander would have led his pilots in the last week would appear to have been the airborne invasion of that Greek island, in which dive-bombers were called upon to attack British naval units in waves in the face of heavy anti-aircraft fire. (As a colonel-general, Grauert ranked only one grade below field marshal. He was promoted to his present rank last July 19.)
