The accident, last December 23, took the life of Elinor Marian Falk, 11, of Milwaukie.

COURT DISMISSES DRUMMOND'S SUIT

The damage suit of Dr. C. I. Drummond against L. F. Belknap, retired minister was dismissed in Circuit court yesterday, under an order signed by Circuit Judge H. K. Hanna.

The motion for dismissal stated the case had been settled without costs to either party. Dr. Drummond in his complaint sought \$2,500 as a result of a crash last January near the Stewart avenue intersection with the Pacific highway, between autos driven by himself and Belknap. Dr. Drummond sustained injuries that required hospitalization.

BOMBER LANDED WITH BAD WHEEL

Denver, June 5.—(P)—An army bombing plane landed safely at the army air corps technical school at Lowry field Wednesday afternoon although a tire on one of the landing wheels had blown out.

The accident apparently occurred as the plane took off. The ship, piloted by Lieut. Arch Campbell, circled over the field on Denver's eastern outskirts for more than an hour after the mishap was discovered. Officials at the field said Campbell brought the huge ship to an almost perfect landing on its one good tire.

MOCK WAR SHOWS GLARING DEFECTS AT CAMP LIGGETT

Camp Hunter Liggett, Cal., June 5.—(P)—Intent on avoiding a repetition of first mistakes, officers of the army's third and 41st divisions today scanned the barren slopes and dusty vales of the Hunter Liggett military reservation for foreknowledge of the terrain over which tomorrow they again lead Fort Lewis' 35,000 soldiers in mimic war.

What errors they made in their first maneuver, concluded Tuesday, were called pointedly to their attention in a critique

by Major General Kenyon A. Joyce, commander of the army's ninth combat corps.

General Joyce found that combat planes attached to the 41st division had machine gunned their own men and that both the attacking 41st and the defending third division had been guilty of improper movement of reserves.

But from a military point of view, the commanding officer held most censurable the units' failure to make best use of natural cover and other forms of concealment.
