**FIRE GUARD CLASS
OPENS TOMORROW**

Annual fire guard training camp for Rogue River National forest will be held at Carberry Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Fifty-three fire guards will attend.

The first morning will be devoted to general assembly discussion of forest policies and tests in first aid. For the remainder of the school, the men will study the fire-finder, fire chasing, fire suppression, map reading and compass and pacing. Experienced guards will be given training in the supervision of CCC crews, fire behavior and duties of fire foremen.

Maurice Tedrow, assistant forester in charge of fire control, will conduct the school. Rangers and protective assistants will be instructors. Ranger Lee Port is in charge of camp arrangements and meals.
