

GOUGING LANDLORDS IN DEFENSE AREAS WARNED TO DESIST

Washington, June 13.—(AP)—Federal authorities today cautioned "rent-gouging" landlords to reduce rentals to reasonable levels voluntarily or risk legal compulsion.

The Office of Price Administration and Civilian Supply distributed by reports of rental increases ranging from 5 per cent to "extraordinary instances" of 100 per cent, stepped into the defense housing picture with a program designed to stabilize rents throughout the country.

In an address prepared for a meeting of the National Housing Inventory, Karl Borders, OPACS rental expert, said the program was aimed particularly at defense areas where the influx of workers and soldiers' families had been so rapid that private and public construction could not keep up with the need.

SEIZURE OF CRETE COST 5,893 MEN

Berlin, June 13.—(AP)—The German army and air force seizure of Crete on Adolf Hitler's personal orders cost 5,893 officers and men in dead, wounded and missing, the high command announced today, and proved that "nothing is impossible to the German soldier."

The announcement also claimed that between January 1 and May 30, 30 allied warships were sunk in the Mediterranean including 23 at Crete, and that "a great number of other units, including several battleships and plane carriers" were damaged.

In the same five-month period, according to this announcement, 103 merchant ships, totaling more than 320,000 tons were sunk in the Mediterranean.

The Nazi casualties listed for the Crete campaign were those of the German army and air force.

McKean Successor To George Baker

Portland, Ore., June 13.—(AP)—The place of the late George L. Baker as manager of Columbia Empire Industries, Inc. was taken yesterday by Robert R. McKean. He was advanced from assistant manager, a position he held for three years.

HERO PEN GUARD DIES FROM FALL

Salem, June 13.—(AP)—Lute Savage, 77, the Oregon penitentiary guard who survived a shot under the heart in the famous Kelly-Willos-Murray break in 1925, died in a hospital here last night from injuries received in a fall.

In the 1925 break, Bert "Oregon" Jones, a prisoner, and two guards were killed. Tom Murray, who shot Savage; Ellsworth Kelly and James Willos escaped, but were recaptured. Kelly and Willos were then hanged, and Murray hanged and Murray hanged himself in his cell.

The 1941 legislature gave Savage a pension.

RACKET CHARGE DENIED BY BLOFF

New York, June 13.—(AP)—William Bloff, head man of the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees (AFL), today pleaded innocent to charges of violating the federal anti-racketeering law and was released in \$50,000 bail.

In releasing Bloff, Federal Judge John C. Knox warned that "if any one of the government's witnesses is molested, in any way, shape or form, or any phone calls are made of a threatening nature, the ball will be re-mitted and the defendant incarcerated."

Bloff was indicted with George Browne, president of the union, and charged with obtaining \$550,000 from leading motion picture producers under threat of calling a strike.

To Cut Power Rates
Salem, June 13.—(AP)—The West Coast Power company announced today it would reduce rates in the Burns area by 15 per cent on July 1. The reduction applies to residential, commercial, general power and municipal pumping service rates.

HER RECIPE



FOOD FOR THE GODS

4 eggs
2 c. White Satin Sugar
1 c. finely chopped dates
1 c. Josephine County walnuts, chopped

8 rounding tablespoons of finely rolled cracker crumbs
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 pinch of salt

Combine as follows: Yolks of eggs beaten until very light. Then add sugar gradually, beating constantly. Add dates and walnuts, and cracker crumbs mixed with baking powder. Lastly, add the stiffly whipped whites of eggs to which there has been added a pinch of salt.

Bake in a well-buttered pudding dish, placed in a pan of hot water. It will require about 1 1/2 hrs. to bake; not to be overdone, but just "set" nicely. Moderate oven.

Serve with whipped cream.
