

MEDFORD UNIQUE ARCHITECT HUNT TELLS ELK MEET

Cantonment Planner Says Town Friendliest He's Seen; Strictly American

Annual flag day services of the Medford lodge of Elks were held last night at the temple with Myron Hunt, architect for the proposed army cantonment, as the guest speaker. Frank DeSouza, a past exalted ruler, acted as chairman.

"You have here the friendliest town I have ever known," said Mr. Hunt, "and I often wonder if your people realize it is one of the few strictly American cities in the land. The little New England town where I was born now has a population 50 percent Polish. In Los Angeles, where I live, we have a mixed population. It is good to know there is a place like Medford."

Facing Problem
"You now have a population of 12,000. You face the prospect of having that population increased by 30,000 soldiers and officers and camp followers, good, bad and indifferent. It is a problem you face. I hope you will spread among them some of your friendliness and Americanism."

"The soldiers who will come," Mr. Hunt continued, "are just like the boys you used to be, just like your sons are today, and just like your grandsons are going to be. They have been selected for military service,

and all came from homes, like your own, made by people such as you know. Loneliness, plain homesickness, is the bane of their lives. If you can do them a friendly word or kindness, it will do your heart good to note how much they appreciate it. It cheers them. There is no greater service than helping others and I know your Medford citizens, out of your wonderful friendliness, will do that."

Should Absorb Corners
The speaker expressed the hope the civilian population engaged in building work would not be set aside in a sub-division, but absorbed into the community, where they can be one of you, and practice your friendliness and ideals of Americanism."

The city, he said, should use the civic facilities it has, instead of building new ones at increased expense.

He complimented the city and county in preparing for new problems with a planning board. He enumerated as among the problems to be faced, those of housing, school space, camp followers, and trailer camps.

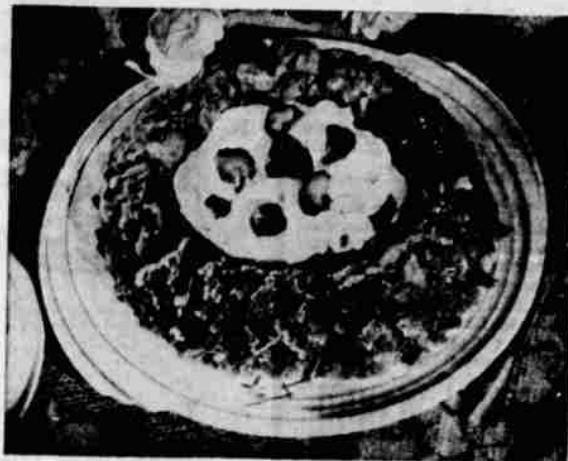

EUGENE COORDINATOR TO GIVE ARMY HEADS VIEWPOINT ON SITE

Eugene, June 13—(P)—Howard Merriam, civilian coordinator on the potential U. S. army cantonment in the Eugene vicinity, left Eugene by plane Wednesday night for San Francisco where he will meet today with a board of U. S. army officers on camp site selection.

Mr. Merriam was invited by the constructing quartermaster corps, to express the community's viewpoint at this meeting where decision will be made as to which of the six proposed sites in this area is most suitable for the proposed army camp.

Detailed surveys of the six sites have been made by the surveyors and engineers connected with the Eugene army office and will be presented at this meeting. Decision of this board will then be forwarded to Washington where final selection will rest with army headquarters. Whether or not Eugene will have a cantonment then depends upon congress' increasing the size of the army and appropriating more camp funds.
