New York, June 19.—(AP)—Philip M. Plant, 39-year-old Broadway playboy, big game hunter and chicken farmer, died last night in Polytechnic hospital of a heart ailment.

With him was his third wife, the former showgirl, Marjorie King, and his mother, Mrs. William Hayward. Two previous marriages, the first to actress Constance Bennett, the second to Edna Dunham, ended in divorce. Fifteen millions inherited from his step-father, the late Commodore Morton F. Plant, yachtman and railroad and steamship mogul, started him on a gay but tempestuous round of activities even before his graduation from Yale.
