

MUZHKS AMAZED WHEN MOLOTOV ANNOUNCES WAR

Associated Press Bureau
Chief Says Russian Hinter-
land Unaware War Near

(Editor's Note: Henry C. Cassidy, Associated Press chief of bureau in Moscow, gives the following first hand report on Russian civilians under the blitzkrieg on the basis of unusual experience as a war reporter. Cassidy, a native Bostonian, was a member of the Paris staff when Germany invaded France and saw the masses of civilians who clogged French roads in flight. The contrast he presents in the following dispatch in the first eye-witness account of wartime Russia outside Moscow by an American newspaperman.)

Moscow, June 27.—(P)—From the Black Sea to Moscow, through regions rarely seen by foreigners recently, even in peacetime, I have watched from behind the Russian lines as the Soviet provinces went to war with Germany.

The general impression was that the Soviet forces got off to a smooth start.

Mobilization was carried out without any apparent hitch. The blackout was installed effectively. Trains were running promptly. Agriculture and industry appeared to be working at top pitch.

The Soviet countryside showed two striking contrasts to France of a year ago.

First, there was no panicky rush of refugees to tangle transport. In fact, I found it difficult for a civilian to move at all unless he had a real reason.

Second, the people maintained complete Slavic calmness and confidence.

War nerves never reached these remote districts.

The skies over central European Russia appeared to be under absolute Soviet control.

Through the Ukraine I saw no German planes, not even the scouting craft such as penetrated deep into France in the early days of the war there.

The war came with startling surprise in the provinces Sunday. The radio the night before and the provincial press that morning had no hint of the conflict.

The population stiffened suddenly and listened open-mouthed to a broadcast of Foreign Commissar Molotov's speech announcing the German attack.

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SOLDIERS TO GIVE 3 OREGON CITIES HECTIC JULY 4TH

Camp Hunter Liggett, Calif.—(P)—Eugene, Roseburg and Klamath Falls can look forward to a hectic Fourth of July this year because the towns will be crawling with Fort Lewis soldiers en route home from June-long maneuvers here.

Motorized troops of the 3rd and 41st divisions and 8th army corps will be lying over about 36 hours in each of the towns since army trucks will not travel on July 4 so as to not interfere with civilian traffic on the holiday.

Merchants can look forward to a tremendous surge in business. The troops will be paid just before they leave this reservation and should be "flush."

Eugene will have the biggest influx because both the west and east columns will converge there. Army officers estimate the first serial leaving here—

which will be in Eugene July 4—will include approximately 6,000 men.

Roseburg and Klamath Falls will have approximately 3,000 soldiers each on the holiday.

While passing through Oregon, former guardsmen and selectees from that state will be issued passes to return briefly to their homes.
