

STATEWIDE DRIVE FOR ALUMINUM IS PLAN IN DEFENSE

Jackson County Defense Council to Organize Collection Scrap Articles Here

Salem, June 27.—(P)—Machinery for a statewide drive to collect scrap aluminum to help the national defense effort was organized today by Acting Governor Dean H. Walker and Jerrald Owen, state civilian defense coordinator.

Immediately after Owen received a telegram today from F. H. LaGuardia, national director of civilian defense, asking that the aluminum drive be started without delay. Owen asked all county defense councils to get busy at once.

Owen said Dean William Schoenfeld of Oregon State college would be asked to organize county agents for collection of aluminum in rural areas.

SUMATRA GIVES GREAT WEALTH TO THE INDIES

Batavia (U.P.)—Four times as large as Java and producing 50 per cent of the dollar imports of the Netherlands East Indies, Sumatra has become, possibly, the richest possession of the Dutch in the Far East.

Most of the island is "Rembu," or impenetrable jungle. Only 8,000,000 people inhabit the territory, but the north portions of the east coast produce vast quantities of rubber, tin and tobacco.

About half of the rubber tree regions are cultivated by foreigners and the rest by native chieftains. Palm products, coffee, and oil also are shipped to foreign markets in considerable bulk. Gold is found in some places. Recently an American firm, whose headquarters are in Manila, began extensive prospecting and opened several mines which promise to be profitable.

Dutchmen have looked to the north apprehensively for some time. Singapore is directly across the Malacca Straits from Sumatra, and parts of the north coast face the part of Thailand that stretches down into the Malay Peninsula.

Exact locations are, of course, secret, but authorities state that Sumatra is well defended by land, sea, and air. "Bases have been established at important points," say army officers.

OHIO BOLSTERS PUBLIC HEALTH BY LEGISLATION

Columbus, O. (U.P.)—Ohio has joined the increasing number of states seeking to reduce syphilis by requiring all applications for marriage licenses to pass a physical examination.

Governor John W. Bricker recently affixed his signature to a bill which requires such examination to be made, beginning August 18.

The anti-syphilis bill was one of several important public health measures which were passed by the 94th Ohio general assembly recently and approved by the governor.

These new laws call for:
1. Establishment of non-profit medical service corporations to offer the services of physicians and surgeons to low and medium income groups on a plan similar to "group hospitalization."
2. A ban on retail sale of fireworks, except cap pistols.
3. A new system of recording births and deaths, providing that probate courts may issue birth certificates to those who have lost or never had them. This provision was regarded as vitally important to many persons employed in Ohio industries handling national defense work where proof of nationality is a requisite.

4. The growing number of "rest homes" for old-age pensioners to be placed under strict state supervision and licensing by the state division of aid for the aged. The homes were the object of much criticism after a number of aged persons lost their lives in fires.

A proposal that the British houses of parliament be moved away from the Thames was abandoned in 1840 partly because the Duke of Wellington pointed out that the buildings, if situated on the river, never could be surrounded by a mob.

Uncertainty Dampens Spirit Of Interned Italian Seamen

Missoula, Mont. (U.P.)—A thousand Italian seamen, interned for the duration of the war at Fort Missoula, eat, sleep, laugh and play games, but are lonely.

They inspect the camp, the Italians, many of whom spoke English, hurled a broadside of questions about the outside world. "How is the war? How far is it to town? Do you have any newspapers and has Mussolini made any speeches? What about Ethiopia?" But the reporters were not permitted to answer. Some of the men were beginning to show the strain, although there was little grum-

bling. Quarters, now cramped, were to be enlarged by erection of 13 fabricated houses shortly, and the chain-link fence, now enclosing about five acres, was to be extended to take in an additional five acres.
