Osa Massen, Reginald Owen In Cast — Picture Here Three Days.

Joan Crawford presents both her greatest dramatic role and her greatest surprise to her fans in "A Woman's Face," gripping drama of a woman's soul, opening a three-day run today at the Craterian theatre, with Melvyn Douglas and Conrad Veidt.

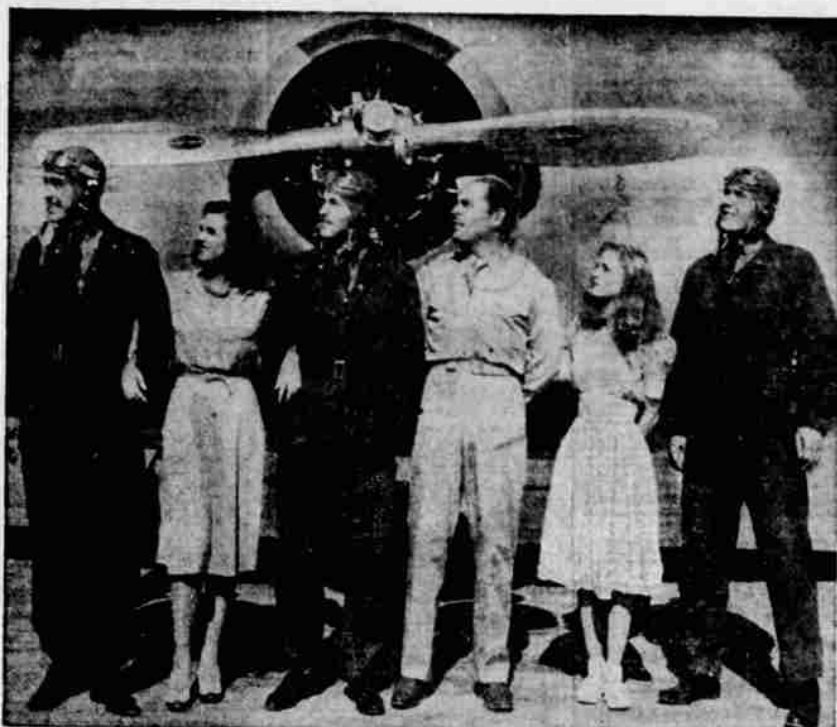

PIONEER OREGON WOMAN PASSES

Portland, Ore., June 28.—(P)—Mrs. Florence E. Klippel, 75, Portland, whose background was inextricably tangled with Oregon's beginnings, died last night of pneumonia and complications.

She was born near Corvallis, the daughter of James and Elizabeth Currier Foster, who came to Oregon in 1845 and 1846, respectively, reaching the Willamette valley when Eugene consisted of one log cabin occupied by Eugene Skinner, Oregon City was a scattered collection of cabins and only a few tents marked the site of Portland.

Her mother was the first white woman over the Cow Creek canyon route into Oregon. She was married in 1900 to Lannes Klippel, Summer Lake and The Dalles sheepman. His father, Henry Klippel, an early Jacksonville resident and Jackson county official, was one of a committee of five men who handled construction of the Oregon capitol in 1873—the building which burned in 1935.

ZONE AGREEMENTS IN AIRCRAFT INDUSTRY IS HILLMAN'S OBJECTIVE

Washington, June 28.—(P)—Sidney Hillman, OPM associate director, announced today that an effort would be made to establish "zone agreements between labor and management in the aircraft industry similar to those being negotiated for shipbuilding.

These agreements would be intended merely to do away with stoppages through forbidding strikes or lockouts, leaving the other problems of employer-employee relations to the normal methods of collective bargaining.

At the same time, Hillman disclosed that conferences are underway between the army, the navy, the maritime commission and the federal works agency and representatives of American Federation of Labor unions for stabilization of work in defense construction.
