FOREST PERMITS NOW IN EFFECT

From today until September 30 national forest fire rules and regulations will be in effect, Rogue River national forest headquarters emphasized in a statement today.

Permits are now required for camp fires excepting in improved campgrounds such as McKee Bridge, Union Creek, Lake O' Woods and South Fork, headquarters pointed out. All improved campgrounds are posted with notices stating that no permit is required. If a campground is not so posted, a permit is required, headquarters stressed. Permits may be procured at any supervisor's office or any ranger or guard station.

Forest campers are required to be equipped with a shovel, ax and water pail of specified minimum dimensions. Smoking is prohibited while one is in transit excepting while traveling over two-way paved or surfaced roads.

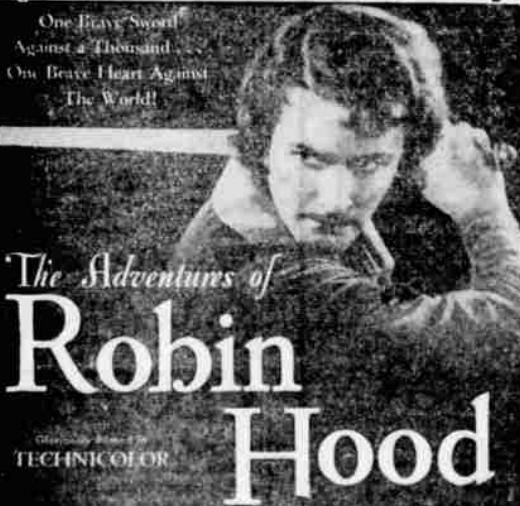
