

STALIN WILL HEAD NEW COUNCIL FOR RUSSIAN DEFENSE

Leaders of Red Government
to Match Wits, Men and
Machines With Hitlerites

Moscow, July 2.—(P)—With virtually all of European Russia organized for war and mobilization extending even to Siberia, the defense of the soviet state was entrusted today to a newly-formed council headed by Joseph Stalin.

In view of the war emergency, an announcement said, the powers of the government were given to the new defense council and all Russians were enjoined to obey its orders.

Here are thumbnail sketches of the Moscow leaders who are matching wits, men and machines against Adolf Hitler and his high command:

Son Of Cobbler
Premier Joseph Stalin, 61—Cast off official anonymity May 7 to become head of the Soviet Russian state, replacing Vyacheslav Molotov, who had held the post 11 years. Born Joseph Vissarionovich Dzugashvili, the son of a cobbler, he was expelled from a seminary to which he had been sent to study for the priesthood because he preached Marxism.

Foreign Affairs Commissar
Molotov, 50—Began his career as a revolutionary at 16 in Kazan, a city on the Volga. By 1920 he was secretary of the communist party of the Ukraine. A former editor of Pravda, party organ, Molotov became chairman of the council of people's commissars (premier) in 1930. In April, 1939, he succeeded Maxim Litvinov as foreign commissar to climax what appeared to be a conflict over Litvinov's diplomacy.

Marshal of the red army Kliment Yefremovitch Voroshilov, 60—Intimate friend of Stalin for 20 years, is a member of the inner circle of the party. Born in the Donbas coal region, he entered the Russian social-democratic party in 1930 and joined its bolshevik wing headed by Lenin. Arrested a number of times for leading strikes, he was exiled finally to Archangel. He escaped and settled in Baku, where he met Stalin.

Work Lag Seen
Georgi M. Malenkov, secretary of the soviet election board (age unavailable)—As secretary

of board, he represents "workers in political education establishments"—meaning teachers of communism. Only last February he described to an all-union conference of the party lags in locomotive, car-building, electricity, timber, paper, fish and building materials industries and cited inefficiency in the sea and river transport systems of the U. S. S. R.

Laurenti Beria, commissar of internal affairs (age unavailable)—Appointed in January, 1940, as general commissar of state security. Like Stalin, Beria is a native of Georgia. He was secretary of the communist party committee in that province before going to Moscow in 1938 to replace Nikolai Yezhov as commissar of domestic affairs and head of the NKVD (political police).

NAZIS PUT LID ON CBS BROADCASTS

New York, July 2.—(P)—The German government has cancelled further CBS broadcasts from Berlin after objecting to a broadcast commenting on the release of British novelist P. G. Wodehouse from a Nazi prison. CBS announced last night that Harry Z. Flannery, chief of its Berlin bureau, had telephoned that German authorities had cancelled further CBS broadcasts from Berlin in retaliation for commentator Elmer Davis' statement that Wodehouse was being treated differently from other prisoners because of his publicity value to Germany.

Davis made his analysis after a broadcast interview between Flannery and Wodehouse in which the latter said he had a suite in a hotel and that he could come and go as he chose.

500 START COURSE AT WEST POINT ACADEMY

West Point, N. Y., July 2.—(P)—On a day when Uncle Sam was registering thousands of young men for selective service, the United States military academy today certified some five hundred youths as its class of 1945. The new plebe group was made up of men from every state and territory of the union.

Composer in Army
Fort Niagara, N. Y. (U.P.)—Pvt. William Bagley has not put aside his musical activities since induction into the army. The composer of the popular songs "Night Has Begun" and "Quito," Bagley now arranges music for a post band of musically-adept soldiers. Bagley formerly had his own dance band.
