FRENCH BOLSTER DAKAR DEFENSE

By the Associated Press. Dakar, strategic port on the westernmost tip of French Africa nearest to South America, is being strengthened to combat any possible landing attempt, informed circles in Vichy reported today as French colonial quarters openly expressed fear of prospective "complications" in the wake of U. S. occupation of Iceland.

The French disclosed no details of the preparations at Dakar, where British and free French forces made an unsuccessful sortie last September.

The same sources in Vichy said Portugal was steadily strengthening her garrison in the important Azores islands in the Atlantic.

SWEDEN BASIN MILL EMPLOYEES WALK OUT

Grants Pass, July 11.—(P)—Forty men who said they belong to no union gave Grants Pass its first local strike today in the memory of oldtimers. The morning crew of the Swede Basin Lumber company struck for 10 cents hourly increase in pay and no increase in hours when, they said, they were asked to work nine hours daily instead of eight.

Most of the men receive 48 and 50 cents an hour, they said, with green chain men 30 cents a thousand and piers 54¢.
