

PAROCHIAL TEXTBOOK CONTENTIONS ARGUED BEFORE SALEM JUDGE

Salem, Aug. 22.—(P)—Arguments were heard today in the suit of Floyd D. Moore, Portland, to force Secretary of State Earl Snell to place on the ballot the referendum against the bill to loan textbooks to parochial and private schools. Circuit Judge L. H. McMahan took the case under advisement.

Moore, executive secretary of an organization which sponsored the referendum against the bill, contended that the referendum petitions which his organization circulated were proper. The bill automatically became law last June 14 when the state supreme court ruled that the ballot title on the measure was improper.

State Senator Rex Ellis (R-Umatilla) and State Representative Allan G. Carson (R-Marion), who sponsored the bill, filed a petition today contending that the sponsors of the referendum improperly included many petitions that had been circulated before the ballot title was held invalid.

WING'S DAIRY IN MAGAZINE STORY
