DOCTORS, NURSES TO BE ORGANIZED

Salem, Aug. 27.—(AP)—The State Civilian Defense council announced today mobilization of the state's medical fraternity into a "medical disaster relief organization," to supervise first aid and relief work in the event of air raids or enemy invasion.

Participation agencies include the Oregon State Medical society, Oregon State Nurses association, Oregon association of Hospitals and the American Red Cross.

Heads of these organizations were appointed to a state-wide committee which will organize county disaster relief committees. Clyde C. Foley of Portland will be executive secretary of this committee.

State Civilian Defense Coordinator Jerrold Owen asked county defense councils to make surveys of hospital facilities, as well as public buildings which would be available for emergency hospitals.
