

WIFE DROWNS ON FINAL CRUISE OF CRESCENT C. BOAT

Newport, Calif., Aug. 29.—(AP)—Death has interrupted the farewell cruise of the 48-foot schooner-rigged yacht Orabelle, for many years the home of Mr. and Mrs. Wilbur H. Royden of Crescent City, Calif.

The little boat was towed into Newport harbor yesterday, two days after the Roydens set sail for Crescent City, with the body of Mrs. Royden aboard.

Royden, 71, and crippled with arthritis, told crew members of the State Fish and Game commission boat Marlin, which responded to his distress signals off Catalina island yesterday, that Mrs. Royden, 58, had drowned the day before.

Royden said he had gone below for a nap when he heard his wife scream. By the time he reached the deck she was in the water 300 yards astern. He jumped in after her. Finding his efforts to reach her were fruitless, he returned to the yacht and brought it about, but when he came up with his wife she had drowned.

The Roydens had been married 33 years. They sailed the Orabelle here from Crescent City last year and had planned to return there to sell her and retire from the sea.

PRESIDENT SETS UP SUPER BOARD; WALLACE AT HEAD

Washington, Aug. 29.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, striving anew to step up arm production, concentrated the supreme control of all the nation's natural resources today in a seven-man board headed by Vice President Wallace.

This board—a super-ministry of supplies—was charged with the duty of deciding what proportion of the country's materials and productive power must go for military essentials, and what may be spared for civilian needs.

These decisions perforce will result in some civilian hardships, the White House stated, but it reported that the office of production management was seeking to ease them as much as possible.

President Roosevelt issued an executive order last night creating the new body—the supply priorities and allocations board. In effect, it meant a reorganization of some of the existing defense machinery, and a limited reshuffling of some key defense personnel.

There has been criticism in many quarters for some weeks over the progress of the arms production drive, over reported friction and duplicating functions existing in various defense agencies, and over the delays in allocating available raw materials to industry.

BUYING BRISK IN STORES OF LAND

New York, Aug. 29.—(AP)—Buying in stores continued to zoom along at a brisk gait this week, and retail sales averaged 25 to 30 per cent above last year for the country as a whole, Dun & Bradstreet reported today.

“Retailing showed no signs of losing the fast pace of recent weeks,” the agency said. “A few centers reported that scarce buying was less marked but there was usually a sufficient expansion in seasonal demand to keep dollar volume moving up.”

“Household goods still held the limelight. Furniture sales spurred as August promotions drew to a close. Demand for higher priced furniture items, pianos, and large appliances was especially heavy in anticipation of the curb on installment selling beginning September 1.”
