

CORN ESTIMATES SHAVED SLIGHTLY, WHEAT INCREASED

Agriculture Department
Says Pear Crop Close
To 31,622,000 Of 1940.

Washington, Sept. 11.—(AP)—The agriculture department today estimated the corn crop at 2,523,964,000 bushels and total wheat production (winter and spring wheat combined) at 957,563,000 bushels.

The corn crop was forecast a month ago at 2,587,574,000 bushels. Production was 2,449,307,452 bushels.

Far Over Average
The combined winter and spring wheat crop was forecast at 950,953,000 bushels a month ago. The crop last year was 816,698,000 bushels and the ten year average production, 747,507,000 bushels.

Winter wheat production this year, the preliminary estimate shows, was 684,969,000 bushels, compared with 589,151,000 last year and 569,417,000 the ten-year average. The yield was 17.0 bushels an acre, compared with 16.3 last year and 14.4, the ten-year average.

The spring wheat crop was forecast at 2,239,700 bushels, compared with 265,987,000 bushels forecast a month ago, 227,547,000 bushels produced last year, and a ten-year average production of 178,090,000 bushels.

More Durum
The crop of durum wheat, included in spring wheat, was forecast at 43,249,000 bushels, compared with 41,132,000 a month ago, 34,776,000 last year, and 27,998,000 the ten-year average.

Other spring wheat was forecast at 224,448,000 bushels, compared with 224,855,000 a month ago, 192,771,000 last year, and a ten-year average of 150,492,000.

The indicated production of other crops, with comparative figures giving the forecast of a month ago and last year's production, follow:

Oats 1,129,757,000 bushels, compared with 1,148,162,000 a month ago and 1,235,628,000 last year.

Barley 349,596,000 bushels, compared with 346,057,000 and 309,435,000.

Rye 46,462,000 bushels, compared with 46,462,000 and 40,601,000.

Buckwheat 5,925,000 bushels, compared with 5,614,000 and 6,350,000.

Flaxseed 31,900,000 bushels, compared with 30,711,000 and 21,217,000.

Rice 60,572,000 bushels, compared with 58,970,000 and 52,754,000.

Grain sorghums 150,667,000 bushels, compared with 128,731,000 and 121,371,000.

Sugar cane (for sugar) 5,890,000 tons, compared with 5,890,000 and 4,268,000.

Sugar beets 9,868,000 tons, compared with 12,730,000 and 12,192,000.

Hops Show Increase
Hops 43,200,000 pounds, compared with 41,408,000 and 42,552,000.

Apples (commercial crop) 128,322,000 bushels, compared with 125,112,000 and 114,391,000.

Peaches 69,754,000 bushels, compared with 69,732,000 and 54,430,000.

Pears 31,646,000 bushels, compared with 31,183,000 and 31,622,000.

Grapes 2,599,000 tons, compared with 2,569,000 and 2,544,000.

Pecans 86,234,000 pounds, compared with 86,641,000 and 86,426,000.

Potatoes 373,853,000 bushels, compared with 369,693,000 and 397,722,000.

The acre yield indicated by Sept. 1 conditions of various crops with comparative figures for a year ago, was reported as follows: Wheat (all) 16.9 and 15.3; winter wheat 17.0 and 16.3; all spring wheat 16.6 and 13.1; durum wheat 16.4 and 11.1; other spring wheat 16.6 and 13.5; oats 30.0, and 35.5; barley 25.0 and 23.1; rye 13.5 and 12.7.

Potatoes 128.7 bu. and 130.3. The condition on Sept. 1 of various crops with comparative figures for a year ago was reported as follows:

Apples 68 per cent of a normal yield, compared with 49 a year ago; peaches 79 and 61; pears 71 and 71; grapes 79 and 76; pecans 84 and 83; pasture 73 and 72; soybeans 83 and 76.

APPELATE 'PHONE SUBSCRIBERS PLAN COOPERATIVE LINE

75 Customers Would Purchase Company's Physical Assets Of Liquidator.

Subscribers served by the Applegate Valley Telephone company in the Provoit district will purchase the

company and operate it on a cooperative basis if present plans are carried through to completion, it was announced today by Bayard M. Getchell, liquidating agent for the old Applegate and Fruitgrowers' bank, owner of the exchange.

"The 75 customers of the telephone company," Mr. Getchell said, "are attempting to form a non-profit organization to purchase the exchange. A. D. Gray of Williams is contacting residents of the area served by the exchange and receiving subscriptions toward the fund to purchase the company."

Mr. Getchell said the price set on the company was \$1,000, with the farmers to assume the taxes.

An Associated Press dispatch from Portland today quoted the Public Utilities commission as stating that the exchange, which has "lost money for years," would go out of business unless the cooperative arrangement is worked out.
