

INSURGENT MINERS SUSPEND EFFORTS TO SPREAD STRIKE

Hazleton, Pa., Sept. 12.—(P)—Efforts to extend a work stoppage by nearly 10,000 Pennsylvania hard coal workers, protesting a union dues increase approved by leaders of the CIO United Mine Workers of America, was temporarily suspended today after a spokesman said it was feared bloodshed might result.

A motor caravan of insurgent members from the union's district 7—one of three embracing the eastern Pennsylvania anthracite fields—attempted to extend the movement into adjoining district 9 this morning, but broke up and returned home after a brief flareup of violence.

John L. Lewis, president of the union, and other international officers have maintained a steadfast silence concerning the organized protest launched three days ago. The miners are protesting increases of monthly dues from \$1.00 to \$1.50 and the annual assessment from \$2.00 to \$6.00. Dues and assessments are collected through the employer by the checkoff system.

TRAIN HITS AUTO ON SIXTH STREET

Mrs. E. E. Vilas, 72, of Route 3 was uninjured, but her car and two others were damaged slightly when the northbound Southern Pacific passenger train struck the rear bumper of her automobile shortly after 8:00 o'clock at the Sixth street crossing last night.

Following the crash, according to city police, Mrs. Vilas' machine was thrown against two unoccupied parked autos registered to T. L. Edsall of 215 Washington street and C. W. Newland of 528 Beatty street. The cars were parked on Sixth street.

Mrs. Vilas, the report stated, was traveling east on Sixth street at about 10 miles an hour. The train was also moving at a slow rate of speed.

EX-G. P. MAN GETS PRISON SENTENCE

Sacramento, Sept. 12.—(P)—Nathan J. Russell, 62, Penryn, Calif., former information clerk for the Grants Pass chamber of commerce, was under sentence of three years in federal prison today for shipping obscene photographs by express.

Postal inspectors said collectors of photography had paid as much as \$70 for groups of Russell's photographs.

The pictures were of Russell's adopted daughter who, Russell said, was adopted from a Montana orphanage in 1927 when she was eight years old and was returned to the institution in 1933.

Russell pleaded guilty before Federal Judge Michael J. Roche who commented, in passing sentence, "in all my experience as a federal judge I have never seen such a display of depraved and obscene pictures."

FISH DYNAMITED IN HARRIETT LAKE

Most of the fish in Harriett lake in the mountain lakes wild area were killed recently by dynamiting and a shelter near the lake was torn down from fire wood, Karl L. Janouch, supervisor of the Rogue River national forest reported today upon his return to Medford from a field trip.

Mr. Janouch said he would report the depredations, violations of federal laws, to the proper authorities for investigation and possible prosecution.

Many rustic forest signs at Lake O Woods were destroyed in the past two weeks and it is believed the same parties were involved in both instances, Mr. Janouch said.

Harriett lake is one of the mountain lakes that have been stocked with fish every year for a long time and the dynamiting nullified the delicate task of the annual planting, Mr. Janouch pointed out. The lake, he added, was littered with dead fish killed in the dynamite blast.

Morale Vitamin In Grain Foods

Many families, without realizing it, are getting too little vitamin B1, recent studies show. This much discussed "morale vitamin," the energy-appetite-growth B1, occupies a top place among the important food values stressed by the Committee on Food and Nutrition of the National Research Council.

Good food sources of Vitamin B1 are the whole grain foods, especially those in which the grain is not highly milled. Cereals made of whole wheat, if carefully selected, afford an appetizing and inexpensive way to help make up the daily quota

of this important vitamin. For example, a breakfast of two National Biscuit Shredded Wheat and cupful of milk provides more than 1-3 the daily minimum adult requirement of vitamin B1. Incidentally, this is the vitamin as Nature provides it. Wheat Filled Baskets
1 1/2 cups brown sugar
2 tablespoons corn syrup
1/2 cup milk
1/4 cup butter
3 cups crumbled National Bis-

cuit Shredded Wheat.
Combine sugar, syrup, milk and butter. Cook until it reaches soft ball stage (238-240 degrees F.). Pour hot syrup over National Biscuit Shredded Wheat in buttered mixing bowl and mix. Line buttered muffin tins with wheat mixture and let stand until firm. Unmold and fill center with fresh peaches and raspberries. Serve with cream, plain or whipped. For interesting variations, fill with chilled custard and top with fresh berries; fill with fresh fruit ice cream.
