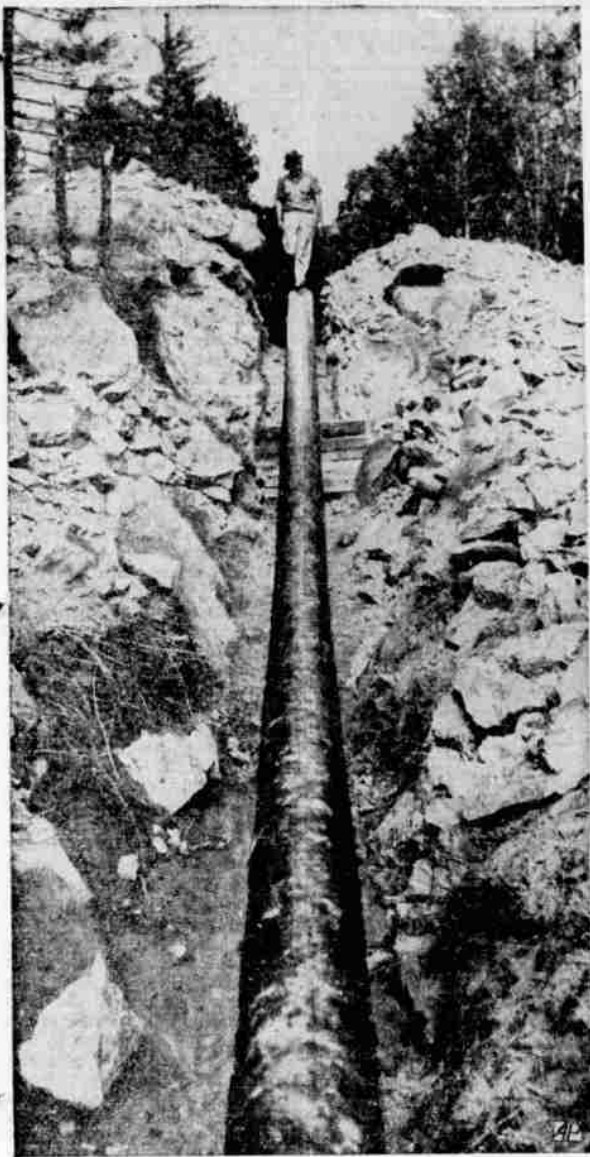

G. A. R. REMNANT AT CONVENTION

Columbus, Ohio, Sept. 15.—(P)—Fewer than a hundred of the great army that answered President Lincoln's call for soldiers four score years ago carried on for the comrades in the 75th national encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic today.

A meeting of department commanders to arrange Wednesday's parade, committee meetings and official greetings from Gov. John W. Bricker and Mayor Floyd Green were on today's program of the diamond jubilee session. National Chaplain Joshua C. Pearce of Denver shared the platform with Rep. John Vorys (R., Ohio) at last night's memorial service and barked off a roll call of his old company.

Then he said simply: "They are all gone. I am the only one left. God bless them all."
