CCC Enrollees to Start Jaunt Home September 21-25

Enrollees of nearby CCC camps will leave by train for destinations in the fourth corps area for discharge of re-enrollment between September 21 and 25, it was announced today at former Medford district headquarters. This constitutes part of the usual quarterly movement.

Forty-five enrollees from Camp South Fork and 60 from Camp Annie Spring will leave from here and 51 from Camp Williams Creek from Grants Pass. Camp South Fork is occupied by a company assigned to the U. S. forest service. Annie Spring is occupied by a national

park service company that in winter moves from Crater Lake to the Oregon Caves national monument. Camp Williams Creek is administered by the O. & C. administration. No information was available on replacements. At the end of the previous quarterly period no fourth corps area enrollees were available for camps in the Medford district. It was thought that for want of enrollees more camps in Oregon might be disbanded. The number of camps in what used to be the Medford district had been reduced from 32 to 16.
