

MIGRANT WORKERS MUST SEEK OWN MEDICAL SERVICE

Any worker living at the farm security administration camp here or other migratory worker in Jackson county who needs medical attention for himself or family must go directly to a doctor and arrange for services on an individual basis as the physicians of Medford and Jackson county have not adopted the program and schedule of the Agricultural Workers' Health association, the camp's weekly paper, the Periscope, states today.

"Practically all farm security administration migratory labor camps have a medical program," the paper says. "It is made possible by the Agricultural Workers' Health association with doctors in the communities where the camps are located. When doctors accept the Agricultural Workers' Health association plan for medical service, the plan is in operation. Medical attention is then available to campers whom the camp nurse and grant aid supervisor or camp manager find eligible and in need of attention. Doctors of Medford and Jackson county have not adopted the program and schedule of the Agricultural Workers' Health association. So each camper must meet his own medical needs."
